C. S. Frank, the retired merchant, who bought the two-story brick building now occupied by Miss Rankin's millinery and notion store on East Ninth street last July from E. H. IMPROVEMENTS AT COMPANY A'S TARGET RANGE

Company A, First Separate Battalion, of this city, has ordered a \$40 field glass for use at the company's target range south of the city, and it will be utilized during the coming target practice season, which begins on May 1st. With this glass the holes made in the target by the bullets can be seen from the firing stand, a thousand yards away. A telephone system will also be put in on the range, enabling those in the firing pit to converse with those at the firing stand and vice versa. These improvements will greatly facilitate the practice and will lessen the danger of accidents.

Greater interest than ever is being taken in the target practice by the National Guardsmen all over the state, for the reason that a team from the several companies will be sent to the Jamestown exposition, and each marksman who thinks he has a chance to make the team, and there are a lot of them, will do his best to secure a high score during the season.

FUNERAL OF MRS. RISDON HELD THIS AFTERNOON

Pioneer of Lane County Who Died at Lewiston, Idaho, Buried in the Odd Fellows' Cemetery by Her Children.

The funeral of Mrs. Pauline Gertrude Risdon, a Lane county pioneer, who died at Lewiston, Idaho, one day this week, took place at the Episcopal church in Eugene this afternoon and the remains were laid to rest beside those of her husband, Judge D. M. Risdon, in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.

The deceased was born at Hartford, Conn., January 18, 1832, and moved to Hartford, Conn., while very young. She came to Oregon in 1852 by the way of the Isthmus of Panama. She was united in marriage to Judge Risdon in Lane county, Oregon, on October 8, 1853. Since January, 1893, she had resided in Lewiston.

At her bedside when she passed away were John Davies and wife, and A. D. Risdon and wife. Mrs. Davies is her daughter and Mr. Risdon her son.

Mrs. Risdon experienced a stroke of paralysis on March 10, and since that time had been in an unconscious condition. Previous to suffering the stroke of paralysis she had been confined to her bed for five months.
