ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

The annual business meeting of the Central Presbyterian church was held in the church building last evening, and after the meeting a supper was served. Officers were elected as follows: Robert Pattison and C. J. Eakin, treasurer; Ethan Collier, clerk; Marion McClain, trustee, to succeed W. O. Heckart, term expired.

Reports read at the meeting showed that there was \$164 collected during the year for home missions, and \$198 for foreign missions. There were added to the church last year 72 members, of whom 40 came from the union of the Cumberland church with the First Presbyterian. The pastor preached 101 sermons and conducted 79 other meetings. He officiated at 73 funerals and solemnized 16 marriages.
