### MANAGER REFUSES TO TREAT WITH MEN

Chicago, April 1.--The situation in the controversy between the Western railroads and the trainmen and conductors today is not materially altered. A series of conferences is being held to discuss various phases of the differences.

Chicago, March 31.--Positions changed in the railroad situation today and the managers became the ones who refused to conciliate. Under the arguments of Commissioners Knapp and Neill, the labor chiefs intimated they were willing to concede something in the interest of peace. The managers, however, declared that they would grant nothing more than they have already offered their employes, and the arguments of the government officials failed to move them.

The labor chiefs went into conference with the government officials at 10 o'clock in the morning at the Auditorium Annex. The session lasted four hours, and after it adjourned the railroad managers met Mr. Knapp and Mr. Neill. That session lasted all the afternoon, when the managers again gave way to the labor committee. It was almost a continuous session throughout the day and evening, for the government officials, first with one side and then with the other, and tonight Mr. Knapp said that they were progressing, but that nothing definite had been accomplished thus far.

### SIX TRAINMEN KILLED IN SMASH-UP

Fort Worth, April 1.--Six trainmen were killed in a head-on collision of two freights on the Missouri, Kansas & Texas railroad six miles south of here today. Fire followed the collision. Two brakemen were cremated and three hundred head of cattle and eight carloads of merchandise were burned.  
The failure of the northbound train to receive an order is said to have been responsible for the wreck.

### TRUST MANAGER PLEADED GUILTY

Chicago, April 1.--F. A. Holbrook, secretary of the combination of manufacturers of school and church furniture, recently indicted by the federal grand jury for conspiring to effect a combine of prices in restraint of trade, today entered a plea of guilty. Sentence was deferred.
