This morning a marriage license was issued at the county clerk's office to a young couple, and a few minutes later a woman rang the office up by phone and demanded that the couple be refused a license if they should apply. When informed that it had already been issued she replied that the young man was her son, that he was not of age, and that there would be trouble for some one. She also said the witness to the license was not of age, and wanted to know if there was some way to stop the wedding. She later called up Justice of the Peace Bryson and that official told her the only thing to do would be to swear out a warrant for the arrest of the witness for perjury.

In swearing that the youth was of legal age. The marriage was to legal age. The marriage was planned to take place at the home of the prospective bride eight miles west of Eugene, today, Rev. O. C. Wright, of the Baptist church, being engaged to perform the ceremony. But before the time to start came the boy's mother telephoned to the minister and he refused to tie the knot.

Undaunted at this rebuff, the would-be groom looked around for another minister and finally found Rev. J. S. McCallum, of the Christian church, who agreed to perform the ceremony. Accordingly he was driven to the home of the bride west of the city, and the marriage rites duly pronounced. Robert P. Critter is the name of the youthful husband and Laura Wynegar that of the bride. The groom formerly lived with his mother here, but is now employed in Portland.

MINISTER KILLED BY STRANGE ACCIDENT

Prineville, Or., April 2.—Rev. Homer N. Street was instantly killed at his home on the Metoles Saturday afternoon by an explosion of dynamite, caused by a horse stepping on it. Rev. Mr. Street had the dynamite under a log and in an unknown way the explosive was scattered. The body of the horse was located, but no trace of Street's body has yet been seen.

The accident happened in the presence of his wife and children. Rev. Mr. Street was known as the ranch-preacher of Crook county. He took an active part in the local option campaign of the state and county, being one of the few ministers of the gospel who are opposed to prohibition.

SAYS MITCHELL DID NOT GET PUTER MONEY

Washington, April 2.—Ezra Hill, a professional statistician of Washington, testified at the Hermann trial today that he was in the room with Senator Puter and Mitchell on March 10, 1902, the day that Puter swore he paid two \$1000 bills to induce the expediting of his patents by Hermann.

Hill said he sat in an adjoining room where he could see Mitchell, but did not hear anything about any money being paid. He said Puter told Mitchell if the patents were not issued he and Emma Watson would be ruined.

A number of witnesses testified that there was considerable feeling between Hermann and John A. Benson. This testimony was calculated to offset the government testimony tending to show intimate relations between Hermann and Benson, who was accused of gigantic land frauds while Hermann was commissioner.

Attorney Worthington announced in court that the defense would offer letters to prove that Hermann continuously for three years urged on Secretary Hitchcock a recommendation to congress to repeal the former law permitting the placing of lien scrip on forest lands of any value, and providing that scrip could only be placed on lands of no great value, the intention being to show that by so doing Hermann would have been working against his own interests if he was engaged in a conspiracy such as alleged.
