LONE BURGLAR OF LORANE IS BESIEGED

(Special Correspondence.)
Lorane, April 3.—The high pressure of excitement here has subsided. Searching parties had abandoned all quest of the burglar who had terrorized this section of country. Everybody hoped he had gone and everybody rejoiced when word came that a man answering to his description had been seen going out of our country by way of Cottage Grove. But the rejoicing was short lived. Last Thursday morning Mr. Conant's children went to look after some stock that was feeding near what is known as the Hughes place, located on the Calapooia mountains just above the Cartwright schoolhouse, at present unoccupied, when they heard some one talking in the house.

They hastened home to report and Mr. Conant phoned Hardy Crow, who accompanied by his son, Warren, at once went to ascertain whether or not the fellow was there. An investigation of the premises proved beyond doubt that he was in the house and consequently a call for help was sent out. Quite a number of men responded and they soon had the place surrounded.

Hardy Crow called for the man's surrender but he refused to give himself up, though after a while he came out, but on disobeying the order to halt was fired on and he then ran back into the house.

R. A. BOOTH SECURES INTEREST IN RICH MINE

Grants Pass, April 4.—With the original owners of the property clamoring for payments long overdue, with the miners disgruntled and growling for wages that should have been paid three months ago, and with all the personal property of the mine and camp attached, such as horses, wagons, office furniture and lumber, with all this upon them and troubles growing thicker every day, the American Gold Fields Company was yesterday obliged to give up the Granite Hill mines and return them to the original owners, the latter of whom are Oregon and California men, R. A. Booth of Eugene being trustee.

The camp, eight miles from this city, which has been a scene of bustle and activity for the past three years, is now still, and the stage that has been making the round trip daily loaded to the guard with passengers and baggage, and carrying mail, has been abandoned; cabins are deserted, the crew is dispersed, and only two or three men remain to guard the property.
