MAY ERECT CARSHOPS AT SPRINGFIELD

Willamette Valley Company Secures Twenty-Five Lots From J. L. Clark - Work of Preparing the Grounds Soon to Begin Addition to Christian Church

The general opinion has been that the Willamette Valley Company does not intend commencing the electric line in Lane county this year, but that opinion has been somewhat changed in the last few days. J. L. Clark made public the news Wednesday that he had just closed a deal with the company whereby they became the owners of 25 lots on F street, between Fourth and Seventh streets, in Springfield. This tract of land was purchased for the car barns, repair shops, yards and depot and it is understood that the work will be commenced at once, preparing the ground for the buildings. We were informed from a reliable source that work would be commenced within a few days, and that the line would be built from Eugene to Springfield and that cars would be running between the two cities in less than twelve months. Henry Stewart also informs us that he has been employed by the company to secure the right-of-way along the route from Springfield up the McKenzie, and will take the field as soon as the descriptions are ready.

Addition to Church.

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Springfield Christian church last Thursday evening, it was decided to make some much needed
