DEBATERS LEAVE FOR SALT LAKE SATURDAY

University of Oregon Representatives are F. V. Galloway and J. C. Veatch, Who Were Leaders in the Tri-State Debate Recently Held - No Trophy Debate

The debaters who will represent the University of Oregon in the interstate debate championship of the Rocky Mountain region and the Pacific Northwest with the University of Utah, will leave for Salt Lake Saturday. The two men are F. V. Galloway, of McMinnville, and J. C. Veatch, of Cottage Grove. The former was leader of the negative team in the tri-state league, and the latter of the affirmative team.

The debate which the men will take part in on April 26, will be probably one of the most important ever held on the Pacific Coast, for the reason that both institutions which the teams represent are champions of the respective sections. The question will be exactly the same as debated with Washington and Idaho, the repeal of the fifteenth, and a clause of the fourteenth amendments. While Oregon won on both sides of the question, it is generally considered that the side—the negative—adverse to the repeal, is the strongest, and that side Oregon will have in this debate.

No Trophy Debate. Because only one or two debaters desire to contest for the alumni medal, it seems quite likely now that the trophy offered by the alumni of the university for the best individual debater in the university will not be given this year. The debate, by the university catalogue, should come on April 12, but as that date is passed, and no other is set, it is not very likely that a trial will be held. All of the debaters do not want to try for the honor, but several do, and it seems rather peculiar that because one or two crack men will not enter that the men of lesser ability should not be stimulated to improve themselves in the popular form of public speaking.

The main reason that the men do not want to enter is that the question would deal with marriage and divorce, and not with the interstate question, which would necessitate a great deal more work.

As the failure of the competition this year will probably mean its abandonment in the future, a number of the students are extremely sorry for the condition, though the fault lies with them most of all.

Monaghan's Lecture. J. C. Monaghan, a member of the consular service of the United States, will deliver an address tonight in Villard hall on "America the Land of Opportunities." Mr. Monaghan has had considerable experience in the work, and before he entered the service was a professor of diplomacy at the University of Wisconsin. Professor Schaefer and Mr. Brindley say that he is an excellent lecturer. No admission will be charged.

LETTER FROM HEAD OF STATE HEALTH BOARD

Written to Mayor J. D. Matlock on Municipal Ownership of Water Works—Success of Educational Institutions Depends on Securing Uncontaminated Supply of Water.

C. J. Smith, M. D., president of the state board of health, writes Mayor J. D. Matlock as follows in regard to municipal ownership of the water plant in Eugene:

"Pendleton, April 16, 1907.
"Mr. J. D. Matlock,
Eugene, Oregon.

"Dear Sir:—Your letter of the 14th at hand and I am glad to note your enthusiasm on the subject of municipal ownership of your water supply. While I am personally not in favor of government ownership of all quasi public corporations, but so far as water supply is concerned and so far as anything so vital to the human economy as a subject of pure water supply, then the city or municipality, as the case may be, should step in and assert its rights. Eugene is especially interested in this matter as the success or failure of the educational institutions depends largely on securing on the part of the city a wholesome and uncontaminated water supply. I can speak authoritatively from the fact that I made a trip to Eugene and examined carefully into the water question there and I have every reason to believe that your city should have a much better supply than such as is furnished by that water company. Of all the contemptible and mean advantages to be taken of a people as a people is to furnish impure and unwholesome water—it is the limit.

"And if you do nothing more for the city of Eugene in a whole lifetime then see to it that she has an up-to-date, pure and undefiled water supply and you will have done for the city of Eugene all that can be hoped of any man and more than could be hoped of most men and leave for yourself a monument that will be hard to efface. And as I said before, bespeaking for you success in your new office and with best wishes, I am very truly yours,
