DOUGLAS COUNTY BRIDEGRROOM MISSING

Philip Standley Secures Marriage License, Deeds Property to Intended Bride, and Now Cannot Be Found.

Roseburg, Or., April 18.—There is still no trace as far as can be ascertained here today of Philip Standley, the lost Camas Valley man, who disappeared a few hours before his wedding.

Standley left home Monday on horseback for Olalla to be married Tuesday to Miss Edna Bushnell, a daughter of Henry Bushnell, a well-known farmer of this county. About 7 o'clock Monday evening Standley's horse returned home riderless with the saddle and bridle still on and the reins secured to the horn of the saddle.

Fearing foul play or accident neighbors were notified and a search was at once instituted. Parties searched all Monday night, Tuesday and yesterday through the mountains skirting Camas Valley and the road to Olalla, but no trace was found, although a place was discovered where it is believed he dismounted, and his handkerchief was also picked up near the same place.

Standley came to Roseburg last week and secured his marriage license, and it is said filed deeds conveying his property to his bride to be. It is also stated that he has for some time been in fear of accident or bodily harm, and it is believed his mind may be deranged.

A later dispatch says that traces at last found of Standley indicate that he is headed for the coast. Search has been discontinued, as it is believed he wishes to skip out. A letter to the girl was made public today, but there was nothing of any value in it.

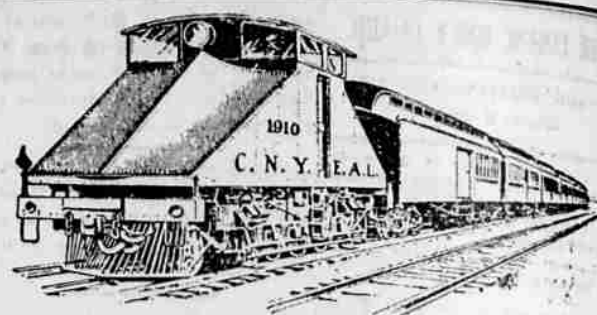
