LAFOLLETTE OF WISCONSIN IN EUGENE

United States Senator Who Has Won Fame as a Foe to the Trusts a Visitor Here This Afternoon. Reception Given Him at Commercial Club - Lectures at Theatre

United States Senator Robert M. LaFollette, of Wisconsin, arrived in Eugene from the north this afternoon and is the guest of the city. He speaks tonight at the theatre under the auspices of the university school of music, this being one of the attractions of the course of entertainments given by the school during the present season. Senator LaFollette is one of the brainiest men of the upper house of the national legislature, and has won a widespread reputation for honesty and morality since his election to that body. He has recently been prominent in the public eye on account of his fight against the railroads and his assistance in passing the railroad rate law.

The little senator, for he is below the average in stature, was greeted at the depot upon his arrival here by President Campbell, Professor Glenn and other prominent citizens and driven to the Hotel Smeed. After a brief rest from his journey on the cars, the senator was escorted to the Commercial Club, where an informal reception is being tendered him. The arrangements for the reception were not completed until about noon today, hence very little publicity could be given to it, but nevertheless a large number of the citizens are present to welcome him to the city and to express their admiration for him and his work in congress.

NEWS FROM THE EUGENE HIGH SCHOOL

Manager Kuykendall is negotiating with the Portland high school for a track meet to be held here in about three weeks. The Eugene high won the meet in which Portland took part a week ago, and this one will be of especial interest.
