The raise was made in order to maintain the high standard that has always been furnished, and none of the students are averse to the change. The price at the girls' club will approximate \$4 a week. The fraternities and sororities approximate \$20 a month.

The Falling and Beekman preliminary contests will be held next Friday afternoon in Villard hall. Twelve seniors have signified their intention of trying, six of whom will be chosen for the finals. The prizes approximate \$150 and \$100 respectively.

'Varsity Notes.

The greatest social function of the university during May will be held Friday night in the armory, when the junior class will hold their dance. Though the interest of the social event would have been greater if the Stanford meet had been pulled off, yet a number of outside people who have been invited have promised to attend. Examinations for the removal of conditions will be held May 6 and 7. There are a number of students who will have to avail themselves of the opportunity to clean up doubtful credits.

A statement which shows the moral standard of the university is made in the public announcement of the summer session, which has just been issued. During the last two years not a single case of discipline has been necessary. Forty-three per cent of the students are members of the Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A. of the university.
