Word was wired back to the second section and the engine and two coaches were cut off and all the doctors taken aboard and went to their assistance. Dr. Williams was among the number and rendered what assistance he could to the wounded and assisted in removing the dead from the wreck. Nearly all those killed were from Pennsylvania and New York.

NEW SIDEWALKS FOR CITY OF SPRINGFIELD

Council Orders All Property Owners on Main Street to Build at Once. Baseball Situation Still Unsettled. General News of the Sawmill City

At the meeting of the city council Monday night it was decided to notify all property owners on Main street, between Fifth and Second, to build new sidewalks at once. The walks are to be built ten feet wide and on a grade of six inches above the established grade of the center of the street. All walks are to be built with four stringers and in accordance with ordinance No. 75. The street committee was also instructed to find suitable locations for public hitching racks and to have the same built at once, also to furnish two public watering troughs. One trough will be placed between the oak trees on Second street, but the location of the other was left to the committee. The marshal was also instructed to have placed at the city hall a public drinking fountain.

Baseball Situation.
The committees that were appointed to hunt for a new location for the baseball grounds met at the town hall Wednesday evening. A spirited meeting was held but no definite plans were decided upon further than if a suitable location could be found the grounds would be moved, but if not the association would continue to play at the present location, but would move the fences from the road that is now being obstructed. The city council authorized the directors of the association to clear the street within two weeks.

WESTERN PACIFIC BUILDING THROUGH EASTERN OREGON

KLAMATH FALLS, Or., May 17.—The Daily Herald says: While it has been the general supposition that a trace has been declared between Hartman, Hill and Gould, developments indicate that there may be a hitch or two in the proceedings. Last week a surprise was sprung at Redding when bids were opened for the purchase of a power franchise on the McCloud river. The highest bid was submitted by Geo. W. Armstrong, who is supposed to represent the Western Pacific interests, but he was unable to land the franchise because of a slight irregularity, although he may yet receive it. Although Mr. Armstrong failed to disclose the identity of his backers, yet he stated that he had purchased about everything in sight along the McCloud. By some it is thought that the Gould system is reaching out for Klamath, and that a branch will reach here ahead of the California Northeastern or any other S. P. branch. The announcement in Saturday's Herald that construction of the Oregon Eastern had been authorized came as a surprise to many. There are those who think a road up the Klamath river, or an extension of the present road to Pockanania will be the first to reach Klamath. Sometime since it was thought that the Klamath Lake railroad might possibly be used as a connecting link in a road to be built by the Gould system, but it attracted very little attention. Since the work on the proposed power plant down near Spencer's is being pushed more vigorously than ever, it has given rise to the question of what it is to be put to. Those who are in a position to hazard a guess think a big sawmill will be one of the set to be supplied with power, the location of which might be in that vicinity.

COMPANY E MAKING RAPID ADVANCEMENT

The members of Company E are to be commended for the rapid advancement they are making in military tactics. Captain Johnson found it unnecessary to form an awkward squad, so is putting the boys through their paces at a rapid gait. Part of their equipment has been received, and the remainder is expected in a few days.
