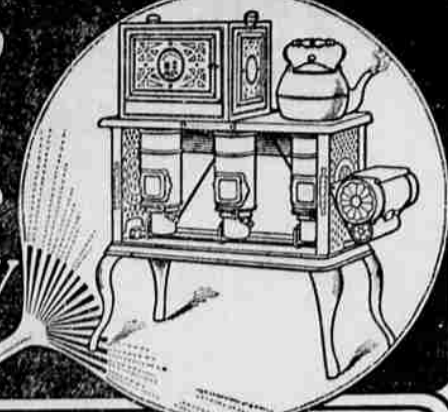

GREAT DAY AT THE FALLS CITY

OREGON CITY, May 20.—Yesterday was the day that has long been looked for by the members of the St. John's church, as well as the citizens of the entire vicinity for some time past. The event was the laying of the corner-stone of the new McLaughlin institute. Although the weather was somewhat cloudy and threatening rain a large crowd was present.

The services of the day began at an early hour, the first service being early mass, which a large number attended. At 10 o'clock second mass was held and those who attended had the fortune to hear Archbishop Christie, who delivered the sermon, and Father Sherman, who delivered a short address. At about 11 o'clock the crowd began to gather about the platform constructed near the place of the corner-stone laying on which the speakers of the day were seated.

Father Hilderbrand was the first to address the gathering and as he did so he spoke of the work that was now nearly completed and of how the thoughts of a short time ago had been brought to a realization. He spoke further of the speakers who were to deliver the addresses of the day and how it had given him great pleasure to ask these prominent men of Oregon to join in the services which were about to take place.

The first speaker introduced by Father Hilderbrand was Mayor Caulfield of this city, who, he said, was the first person he became acquainted with when he came to this city some 19 years ago.

CURTIS LUMBER CO.'S STORE IS BURNED

The store of the Curtis Lumber Company at Mill City was discovered in flames about 4 o'clock yesterday morning, at the time being under such headway that it was impossible to get any of the goods out. By a desperate effort the books of the company were saved, with no time to spare. The yard of the company is close to the store, filled full of costly lumber, and it required all the efforts of the crowd that gathered to save it, but this was accomplished, albeit by the company's hose, kept in readiness.

The store was a general one, with a big variety of goods, about \$30,000 in stock being carried, all burned, besides the buildings, a total loss of nearly \$35,000, on which there is a small insurance of only \$10,000 to \$12,000.

The origin of the fire is thought to have been incendiary.—Albany Democrat.

Mr. Pelz, who is part owner of a big cattle ranch in the mountains of Wyoming, was a caller at the Guard office yesterday and showed the force a number of photographs of several bands of elk taken on the ranch while the snow was on the ground. In the winter they are tamer and it was possible to secure photographs at long range. A very small part of the collection of teeth was also shown.
