



GOLD BRICK FROM BLUE RIVER MINES

W. T. Shurtleff, New Manager of
Great Northern and Treasure,
Brings Out Bar of Yellow Metal.
Doctor Mine Will Soon Resume
Operations - An Active Season.

Glenn Powers, the Blue River merchant, writes his father, A. S. Powers, of this city, that W. T. Shurtleff, the new manager of the Treasure and Great Northern mines in the Blue River district, had arrived out from the camp with a gold brick weighing a pound, the result of only a few days' run of the mill at the Treasure or the Great Northern, it is not learned which. This indicates that ore exists there in large quantities, and we may expect to hear of bricks weighing several thousand dollars each being brought out at frequent intervals from now on.

Mr. Shurtleff is using his new system of extracting the fine gold from the ore, and the securing of this brick of gold would indicate that he has already proven a success. The formation in the Blue River district is such that a great deal of the gold is lost when treated under the ordinary system, but by Mr. Shurtleff's method it is claimed a very large portion which was formerly lost is now retained.

Doctor Will Resume.
Mr. Powers also writes that the Doctor mine, owned by Dr. C. F. Candiani, the Italian consul at Portland, and others, is to resume operations within a few days. This is said to be one of the richest mines in the district, and it is expected it will soon become a big producer.

Prospects are very bright for an active season in the district this summer. The camp was very quiet all winter and spring, and things began to look pretty blue up there, but upon the announcement that the Great Northern and the Treasure had changed ownership and would operate again the hopes of the owners of the properties in the district have risen to a high point.

Men Are Scarce.
Mr. Powers writes that miners are hard to secure. The Great Northern and Treasure people would like to operate their plants night and day, but owing to the scarcity of men are able to run only a day shift.

OREGON WILL MEET O. A. C. SATURDAY

The Oregon track team, which will capture the championship of the Northwest this year, as last, will meet Corvallis next Saturday on the O. A. C. field. Oregon, of course, expects to beat the Agries, and the score should stand about the same as against Pullman. The farmers claim to be full of surprises, however, and the exact way the events will come off cannot be foretold. Oregon should stand but little show of getting more than first and third in the mile, but seems very likely to take all the places in the sprints, the first two places in both hurdles, and all the places in the weights. She is very likely also to get a place in the mile, in the half, and in the quarter that will net a number of points. The broad jump also should go completely to the 'varsity' lads, while O. A. C. will no doubt take first place in the high. The Agries should also take the relay race.

Track Is Bad.
The Pullman team report the O. A. C. track to be in very bad condition, and that being the case, there is not likely to be much done in the way of breaking records. This does not hold good in regard to the weights, and it would not be surprising at any time is Zacharias, Hug and McKinney should burst up a record book.

Are Great Men.
These three are weight men who could win points in any meet in the United States; for instance their distances in the Pullman meet exceeded those made in the Harvard-Yale meet many feet. It is very rare indeed that such a trio in college comes together.

After the O. A. C. meet Oregon has two other contests. The first will be the interstate triangular meet between Washington, Idaho and Oregon at Seattle. The next, though it is not yet certain, will be with Whitman about June 8. There has been some talk of sending just eight men there, and trying results in that fashion. The Whitman track is said to be very fine, and Kelly and his fellows should break records there.

**NEW SAWMILL AT
WALDPORT, LINCOLN CO.**
August and Fred Fischer, Lane County Lumbermen, Interested in New Company on Coast.

J. C. Hammel and wife, of Corvallis, were in the city yesterday. Mr. Hammel is associated with August Fischer and Fred Fischer, Lane county sawmill men, in a company which will erect a sawmill at Waldport, on the Lincoln county coast. The Corvallis Gazette has the following concerning the enterprise:

August Fischer and J. C. Hammel returned the last of the week from a business trip to Waldport, where they are interested in a recently organized concern known as the Waldport Lumber Company. J. C. Hammel is president and general manager; Will F. Keady, secretary; A. B. Lundeman, treasurer and storekeeper; and August Fischer, vice president.

The firm has secured a sawmill and about 40,000,000 feet of timber at Waldport, the timber having been previously owned by August and Fred Fischer and Mr. Keady. J. C. Hammel and Mr. Keady will, it is understood, assume charge of the plant. Mr. Hammel has had much experience along this line, which will enable him to take an active part in operating the plant. The product of the mill will be shipped to San Francisco.
