QUARREL OVER SELECTION OF SCHMITZ JURORS

San Francisco, May 28.—The work of securing a jury to try Mayor Schmitz is proceeding slowly today. Forty-one persons responded to their names from the special venire of fifty when court opened this morning. During the examination of Talesman J. R. Blanchard, a street car contractor, it developed that Blanchard had paid to Frank Maestretti \$400 commission for collection of one of Blanchard's claims against the city. Maestretti was at that time president of the board of public works, but later was removed by Mayor Schmitz.

The discussion over Blanchard's qualifications led to a heated argument and counter accusations of falsifying between counsel. Judge Dunne finally threatened to send Lawyer Barrett, of the defense, to jail for contempt.

On Prosecutor Honey's insistence Blanchard was declared unfit to act on the jury trying Schmitz.

L. R. ALDERMAN SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Graduate of University of Oregon With Class of 1898 and at Present County School Superintendent of Yamhill - Elected by Eugene School Board

At a meeting of the board of education last evening, Prof. L. R. Alderman, at present county superintendent of schools in Yamhill, was elected as city superintendent of Eugene's schools to succeed M. H. Arnold, who has tendered his resignation.

Prof. Alderman is a graduate of the University of Oregon with the class of 1898. In 1898 and '99 he was principal of the Halsey public school; in 1899 and 1900 principal of the North Side school at Brownsville; in 1900 and 1901 vice principal of the McMinnville public schools; in 1901 and 1902 superintendent of the McMinnville schools, which position he held until elected county superintendent in 1904. He will resign that office to accept the position of city superintendent of the Eugene schools. His salary will be \$1400.

Geo. Hug and Paul G. Bond, graduates of the University of Oregon this year, were elected to positions in the high school. Mr. Hug at a salary of \$75 a month and Mr. Bond \$65.

E. J. Moore, at present city editor of the Register, was tendered the position of principal of the Geary school at a salary of \$75 a month, but he has not yet decided to accept it. He held that position one year several years ago.

There remains the principalship of the high school and a vacancy in the primary grade at the Geary school yet to fill.

S. P. CO. WILL BE FORCED TO SELL SAYS HAWLEY

Hon. Wm. C. Hawley, representative in congress for this district, dropped into Ashland, Saturday night, on his return from a visit to Klamath and Lake counties, and will spend the week among his constituents in Jackson, Josephine and Douglas counties, says the Ashland Tidings. Mr. Hawley will be in Ashland again in July, having taken a place on the Chautauqua program here this year.

Our new congressman is out getting in touch with the people, and their needs, and is making a better impression than ever among them, as an earnest and honest advocate of their interests. He has taken a deep interest in the railroad land question of such vital interest to the people of western and southern Oregon, and is of the opinion that the railroad company will be forced to sell its immense land holdings as per the provisions of the act of congress, which granted it in full of a bonus for the building, equipment and maintenance of a railroad and telegraph line through this country. It was a trust, he thinks, and the railroad company has no legal right to hold the lands for speculative purposes, but must sell them to actual settlers at prices not to exceed \$2.50 per acre. Mr. Hawley a few days ago received a letter from the land department at Washington giving a construction of the phrase "actual settlers." The letter follows:

Department of the Interior.
General Land Office.
Washington, D. C., May 15, '07.
Construction of the term "actual settlers."

Hon. W. C. Hawley, Salem, Oregon. Sir: In the case of the United States vs. Jones—10 L. D. 23—the department had under consideration the act of May 28, 1880, (21 stat. 143) which gives certain actual settlers the right to purchase lands in the Osage Indian reservation in Kansas. It was held in the said decision that the term "actual settlers" refers

to one who had made settlement on the land and followed same by residence. This has been the ruling of the office in regard to the meaning of the term "actual settler" and the same ruling would hold good in regard to the term "actual settler" when used in a grant to a railroad company.
