A. A. Aaby has just finished building a cement walk in front of his residence property on West Sixth street.

The work of improving the south room of the Pratt block, formerly Pickett's, for Friendly's clothing department began today.

Mrs. G. R. Chrisman has the thanks of the Guard for a bouquet of roses, the largest and most beautiful that have brightened our annals this year.

The funeral of Harry Jones, of Jasper, who died at the Eugene hospital Thursday, will be held Sunday afternoon with interment in the Smith cemetery near Jasper.

There will be a recital at Villard hall, at the university, next Friday evening, June 7, given by the piano department of the School of Music. The program will appear later.

The Catholic Ladies' Altar Society will hold a social in Engle's hall on Monday evening. Refreshments will be served. Music by Henderson's orchestra. An enjoyable time assured to all who attend.

Justice of the Peace Bryson has awarded Allen Eaton \$75 damages from W. G. Martin for the alleged non-performance of a contract in the sale of a job printing plant. The case will be appealed by Martin to the circuit court.

A deed for 334.88 acres of land covering a portion of the Fairmount heights from William W. Jenkins to H. R. Kincaid was filed for record with the county clerk today. The price given in the deed is \$8000. This land adjoins the big ranch already owned by Mr. Kincaid in that section.

The tract of 10,000 acres of land county timber land on the McKenzie which was sold to the Michigan mill-lionaires, as mentioned in Thursday's Guard, is the tract sold by the Harris-Bean combination to Portland parties a few months ago, most of it for \$21.40 per acre. The Michigan people paid \$50 an acre for it.

A new platform is being built along the entire front of the Allen Fruit Company's cannery and the plant is being placed in readiness for the season's run. Manager Allen says the cherry crop will not be very large this year, lighter than in some parts of the valley. The prune crop outlook is quite good, however, he says.

Mrs. Mary Cook today began suit in the circuit court against J. M. Cook for divorce, alleging desertion. They were married in Lane county on or about July 27, 1897, and have no children. The plaintiff alleges that her husband deserted her November 1, 1904. She also asks for a decree declaring her the sole owner of lots 3, 4 and 5, block 5, Junction City, J. M. and G. A. Pipes are her attorneys.

In the circuit court today a suit entitled J. Hanks Hill vs. Thos. W. Poole and J. M. Nichols was filed. This is a suit to recover the sum of \$78 with interest at ten per cent from April 2, 1906, on a promissory note. Another suit is that of Hulce, Bradford Co. vs. Geo. L. Jennings and Clifford Edwards, to recover \$50.32, alleged due on a bill of goods. L. M. Travis is the attorney for the plaintiff in each suit.

There came near being a blaze in the Titus block last evening. About 6 o'clock the fire running up the Schwaning & Lindley barber shop burned out and the flames shot sky high. The pipe hole in one of the rooms on the second floor was open and sparks were beginning to drop through the hole to a bed below. Had the fact not been discovered until a few minutes later there would have been considerable damage done.

County School Superintendent W. B. Dillard has for some time past been working on a plan to get the Western division of the State Teachers' Association to meet in Eugene next year. The city teachers unanimously favor the plan, and with the instructors in the university behind the plan the invitation will be made cordial and urgent for the next teachers' meeting here. The meeting this year at Salem, July 2 and 3, will be well attended by Lane county pedagogues.
