LOST EIGHT JERSEY COWS IN BARN FIRE

Saturday night at 12 o'clock Jens Elgaard, who owns the old poor farm two miles west of the city, lost eight valuable Jersey cows and a good barn by fire. It is not known how the fire started. Mr. Elgaard was up till 10 o'clock that night and everything was all right at that time. Captain Beerman, who was on his way to Eugene from the western end of the county, while passing along the road discovered the barn on fire. He awoke Mr. Elgaard, but it was too late to save the cows, which had been shut up while a fence around a grain field was being built. A wagon and the horses were saved, but the cows were left to perish in the flames, as it was impossible to get where they were.

The barn was a substantial structure and was of good size. The cows were valued at \$50 each. The total loss is probably \$500 or \$600, with no insurance.

The blaze was seen in town by Nightwatchman Croner and others. It appeared to be close in, and Croner awakened the firemen and had ready to start in case an alarm was turned in, but it was soon learned that the fire was too far out.

THROW NAMES IN WASTE BASKET

WANTED WIFE TO ENTER SHAMEFUL LIFE

A recent issue of the Oregonian contains the following concerning a couple formerly residing at Florence:

Alleging that her husband, John H. Ford, continually urged her to enter a life of shame for his benefit, Stella Ford, 17 years old and a bride of a year, asked for a divorce in Judge Frazer's department of the circuit court yesterday. Her story is one of abuse and inhuman treatment from the time she married Ford at Eugene, Or., February 16, 1906. She said he struck her on various occasions and from the first, was unfaithful and unreasonably brutal. Finally she left him at Wendling, where he was working in a sawmill. She has been living with her sister at 270 Grant street ever since.

Dave Fisher, a street car conductor, testified that Ford was a drunkard and "good for nothing." The lawyer representing the young wife said that the girl's mother was dead and that the girl was misled and deceived by Ford.
