EUGENE FURNITURE MEN IN INDICTED LIST

The Portland evening papers yesterday printed the names of the Oregon furniture dealers who had been indicted by the federal grand jury for maintaining a trust, as told about in the Guard's Associated Press dispatch last evening. The list includes the following Eugene men: H. M. Manville; "John Doe" McKinney, who are in the second hand business here; J. W. Kays; J. G. Chambers (F. E. Chambers' doublet); George L. Jennings and Clifford Edwards, who sold their business to Dugan & Miller, and H. Gordon, who sold out to Campbell-Fellman Co., and who is now residing at Portland. None of these men have yet been served with papers of arrest. Mr. Manville and perhaps some of the others will go to Portland and at once to look into the matter. These men all signed the membership roll of the Oregon Retail Furniture Dealers' Association, but none of them have paid any dues and it was presumed by all that their names had been dropped from the roll. Their indictment is a big surprise, but none of them think they will be prosecuted.

MORNING FIRE IN BUSINESS DISTRICT

One Story Residence on Olive Street Back of Schneider Block Partially Destroyed - Occupied by Two Boys Who Say They Do Not Know How the Fire Started

The little one-story residence on Olive street between the Schneider block and Burbach & Bristow's blacksmith shop was partially destroyed by fire this morning about 8 o'clock. The building is owned by Gregory Burbach, the blacksmith, who had it leased to J. H. Vincent, the restaurant man. It was occupied by Alex and Edmund Tweed, aged about eleven and nine years respectively, and who are orphans, cared for by their uncle, H. B. Garber, who is now in a logging camp on Fall Creek. The boys were in the Vincent restaurant at the time the fire was discovered and say they do not know how it started. They say there was a glass jar of kerosene on the table in the south bedroom, where the fire originated, but they say they had no lamp burning nor were they striking matches in the room this morning. When the flames were discovered they were issuing in large volumes from the windows of the building. The alarm was given and the fire team made a quick dash to the scene of the conflagration. A stream from the hydrant at the Bell grocery corner and one from the chemical engine were soon playing on the flames and they were extinguished in quick order. The house is practically ruined, however, and perhaps will be torn down, as it is old and valueless. There was no insurance. Some of the household goods were saved, but most of them were destroyed.

Had the fire gained further headway before being discovered it might have endangered the Schneider block and other buildings surrounding. Fireman Croner wishes the Guard to advise the people whenever they discover a fire to keep their heads and go to the nearest telephone and ring up the fire station, telling in as few words as possible the location of the fire. Much time will be saved in that way. This morning several men were on the streets yelling "fire" before any one telephoned to the fire station.

OPINION OF ATTORNEY GENERAL ON REFERENDUM

The opinion of Attorney-General Crawford regarding the University of Oregon referendum petitions is as follows, addressed to the secretary of state:

"Replying to yours of the 23d instant, requesting opinion of this office as to whether chapter 226 of the laws of 1907 had been complied with in the petition presented for filing asking that chapter 24 of the laws of 1907 be referred to the legal voters of the state for approval or disapproval, permit me to say that said chapter 226 in a law to provide for carrying into effect the initiative and referendum powers reserved by the people in the constitution, and section 2 reads, in part, relative to referendum petitions, that 'Every such sheet for petitioners' signatures shall be attached to a full and correct copy of the measure on which the referendum is demanded.' The form given for referendum petitions provides for the title of the act being stated in the form. Then section 3 provides in part: 'The forms herein given are not mandatory, and if substantially followed in any petition it shall be sufficient, disregarding clerical and merely technical errors.'

"I am of the opinion that clerical and technical errors do not mean a material omission or part of the title or the text, and this view is strengthened when we refer to the above quotation from section 2, providing that referendum petitions shall be attached to full and correct copies of the measure. I am of the opinion that the legislature, in using the language full and correct copy of the measure, intended to emphasize the proposition that there must be a full and correct copy of the measure and that any material omission would be fatal.
