BIG TUNNEL AT WEST COAST CO.'S MINES

Former Oregon Securities Property
Scene of Activity - Mill Running
Steadily and Work on Tunnel
2000 Feet Long Will Begin
Soon

Cottage Grove, June 7.—A. J. Adeo, superintendent of the Oregon Securities property, now known as the West Coast Mines Company, was in Cottage Grove for a few days and reports the mill running. In the near future the new company will start the tunnel at or near the mill. It will be about 2000 feet in length and tap the Champion mine at a vertical depth of 1400 feet. This enterprise is looked upon by all those interested in Bohemia with a great degree of interest, as it will settle the question as to the depth and value of the Bohemia mines. We predict it will give old Bohemia a boom that will surprise the Bohemians themselves.

DORA JENNINGS LIES NEAR DEATH AT GRANTS PASS

Grants Pass, Or., June 6.—Suffering with an incurable disease and with but a few more days to live, Dora Jennings, the girl who with her brother, Jasper, was tried in the Josephine county court for the murder of her father, is spending what little strength remains in her wasted body in wild ravings and cries of terror. She declares her attentive old mother and her brothers are trying to poison her. She refuses both medicine and food, believing it is drugged.

"They want to get me out of the way," she cries aloud. "They are trying to kill me—to kill me." At first she screamed her words of terror, but now life is so far spent and her strength so nearly exhausted that she can speak but little above a whisper.

Lies on Deathbed.
Every day Warden Cheshire accompanies Jasper Jennings from the county jail to the little house in the suburbs of Grants Pass where the Jennings family now reside, and where the girl lies on her deathbed. Dora scarcely recognizes her brother and will give him no greeting, but declares that he, too, is in the plot to kill her. Jasper is awaiting his second trial for the murder of his father, but as the prosecuting attorney has placed a motion before the court asking that the case against him be dismissed the boy will no doubt be given his freedom.

Dora was acquitted on her second trial some months ago. It was one of the most hotly contested cases ever tried in the Josephine county court. It was the belief of every one who was at all acquainted with the case that she would be found guilty. The fact that she and her smaller sister occupied the same room, with their bed but two feet from the bed occupied by the father in the little room of the log cabin at Granite Hill, in which he was murdered, seemed a certain indication that the girl at least must have been an accomplice in the crime. But she told one story and could not be shaken from it. She declared she heard no shot or sound during the night and that she knew nothing of the crime till the next morning, when she awoke and discovered her father dead in bed.

Calm During Trial.
During her trial Dora displayed remarkable calmness and self-possession. The cutting sarcasm and stinging invective of the prosecuting attorney brought only a pretty smile from her. She sat through the cross-examination unmoved, and the jury could do nothing else than acquit her.

Maldy a Mystery.
The physicians who are attending her are nonplussed as to the nature of the malady that is slowly and surely sapping the life of the once robust young woman away. They are baffled not only by their inability to define the nature of the disease but by the girl's absolute refusal to take medicine. They have despaired of saving her life and declare it is only a matter of a few days till death must claim her. Then will be closed forever the secret and dark mystery of the old miner in the little cabin at Granite Hill.

ROBNET TESTIFIES STRONGLY FOR DEFENSE

Moscow, Idaho, June 5.—Clarence W. Robnet, bookkeeper in the Lewiston National bank, and one of the co-conspirators in the North Idaho land conspiracy case, on trial in the federal court before Judge Delrieu, took the witness stand on behalf of the defense today, and his testimony, taken as a whole, from a layman's point of view, was a signal triumph for the defense. What his testimony, direct or cross-examination may have produced for either side as a basis for argument before the jury remains to be seen. Suffice it to say that Robnet explained away to the evident satisfaction of the defense at least the serious allegations made against the defendants by witnesses and the phraseology of the indictment.

Robnet was on the witness stand about two hours, during which he gave his testimony without hesitation. On cross-examination, which ordeal was surprisingly brief, the witness apparently kept himself well in hand and did not become confused. In substance his testimony was a general denial of every allegation made against the defendants.

Robnet admitted holding every conversation testified to by witnesses for the prosecution in which they declared he made overtures to them illegally to take up land. But Robnet had an entirely different version to place upon the conversations. According to his statements the witnesses who testified against the defendants and himself on his trial last November swore to a long series of flat falsehoods. There was never a word uttered by him to entrap them, according to his statements, which could have been construed to mean that he wanted them to violate the law when it came to taking up timber claims.
