A NEW TOWN TO BE BUILT BELOW EUGENE

HONORE PALMER BUYS CHAS. SEVERSON FARM OF 103 ACRES ADJOINING SAWMILL SITE

Reported That Tract Will Be Laid Out Into Town Lots and Either Sold or Rented to Mill Hands. Store May Be Established by Company—Willamette Valley Company May Extend Electric Line to Mill.

The Guard learns that Honore Palmer, the financial head of the Storey-Bracher Lumber Company, which is to erect a large sawmill on the Bangs' Park tract of land below the city, has purchased of Charles Severson his fine farm of 103 acres, formerly the McClung farm, adjoining the mill site on the southwest, and across the railroad track from it. The price paid is said to have been \$100 an acre. From all reports it is the intention of the company to lay out a small town on this farm and either build houses for its employees and rent them or sell the lots. It is also probable that a store will be conducted by the company and the employees will purchase their groceries and small articles of dry goods, hardware, etc., there. The mill will employ 200 men or more and they and their families alone will make a good-sized village.

The site of the proposed town is about two miles from the limits of the city. While the store or stores there will of course furnish the mill hands and their families with the immediate necessities of life, they will come to Eugene to do their big trading. Then a large amount of money will be expended in Eugene by the mill people in purchasing supplies. The Willamette Valley Company will in all probability extend its electric line to the mill and the new town will be a suburb to the city, just as Fairmount is now.

It is reported that the Willamette Valley Company intends to use the portion of the Bangs' Park tract still held by Attorney Chas. A. Hardy as a site for shops and car barns, although this cannot be confirmed.

Work Begins Soon. Work on the new mill will begin within a very few days. Surveys have been made for the sidetracks and the "Y" and the railroad company will soon send a force of men here to build the tracks so that the material for the mill can be landed on the site without unloading it from the cars and hauling it by wagon.

The mill will be located about two hundred yards from the railroad on an elevated tract on the west bank of the lake in the park, which will be used as a log pond. The lake has plenty of water all the year round and is six or seven feet deep at its lowest stage. With a little dredging and widening its banks there will be plenty of water to float the logs, which will be dumped into the lake from the cars.

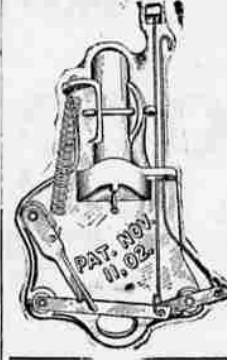
