DOUBLING CAPACITY OF HURD SAWMILL

Large Force of Men at Work Enlarg-
ing Plant at Florence—Several
Vessels Bar Bound.

Florence, June 10.—The Hurd
Lumber and Navigation Company has
a large force of men at work enlarg-
ing the capacity of its mill at this
place. When finished the mill will
have double its present capacity. This
improvement has been made necessa-
ry owing to the increased demand for
lumber in the past year.

The companies operating mills at
Florence have experienced a great
deal of trouble the past season in
shipping their lumber, owing to the
shoal condition of the bar at the
mouth of the Stuslaw river. At
present there are several thousand
feet of lumber on the docks awaiting
shipment on this account. Several
vessels are bar bound there now.

The timber values around Florence
have doubled in the past year, and at
the present prices Eastern firms are
buying quite extensively in this dis-
trict.
