FRUIT CANNERY
STARTS UP FOR
SEASON'S RUN

The Allen Fruit Company's cannery in this city was started up for the season's run this morning with twenty-five or thirty women and girls and six or eight men at work. Strawberries are the first to be worked on, and are being put up in quart cans. The crop this year was not as large as usual and there will not be a very big run on them, although the force will be employed several days putting up the big luscious berries. Cherries are beginning to come in. Manager Allen says the rain hurt the crop some by cracking the fruit, but the later varieties are not injured in the least, and there will be as large a crop this year as last, notwithstanding the general opinion to the contrary.

There have been a good many improvements made about the cannery since last season. A new floor has been laid throughout the entire building, a new platform has been built in front of the building and the machinery repaired and some of the old replaced with new. It is expected that the season this year will be another long one, as the prospects for large crops of other fruits are good.

**MORE POWER
FOR ELECTRIC
RAILROAD**

The Willamette Valley Company this morning received from the East two boilers of 300 horsepower capacity each for the Springfield electric plant and they will be utilized in furnishing power for the operation of the Eugene street railway line and the Eugene-Springfield railway. A huge engine is expected within a few days, and when it comes they will at once be set up, and by the time the street car line is ready for operation the engine and boiler will be ready to turn the big dynamo to furnish the necessary juice. A large new dynamo arrived at Springfield several months ago for this purpose and has been placed in position. Another carload of rails arrived this morning and was unloaded, the rails being piled up on Fifth street, near the Hotel Gross. Construction work on the streets will begin within a few days, or just as soon as the paving company is ready to start in. The Willamette Valley Company is getting impatient to start in with the work, as everything is in readiness

and they want to get the line completed in time to comply with the terms of the franchise. The paving company is blasting rock at the quarry on the west slope of the butte, and the crusher is in operation, but it is not learned when they intend to begin grading the street. People are becoming anxious to see the beginning of the work, but they will have to be patient. Things will be humming soon.
