CONFERENCE AT PHILOMATH

W. O. Zeigler, who is up from Portland, having come here from Philomath, where he attended the annual conference of the United Brethren church, which closed on Sunday, informs the Guard that Rev. C. C. Bell was appointed to the Eugene pastorate. He is at present at Oakland, Cal., and is said to be a very able man. Mrs. Numalt was appointed for the Irving church and the Eugene pastor will supply the Goshen pulpit.

The conference was presided over by Bishop W. M. Bell, who presided last year when the conference was held in Eugene.

The board of trustees of Philomath College met during the conference and planned for greatly enlarging the work of the school. Sunday the sum of \$5250 was raised for the work and a canvass will be once started in this state as well as in the East. It is planned to also a large endowment fund to put the college on a much higher plane of excellence.

WORK TRAIN

AND FLYER IN COLLISION

Last night about 6:30 o'clock there was a collision between the south-bound flyer, due here at 7 o'clock, and a work train about one mile north of Cottage Grove, as the flyer was coming toward Eugene at a good rate of speed. The caboose on the work train was completely splintered and the tender of the engine badly damaged by the collision. The passengers on the flyer were badly shaken up as the train came to a sudden standstill, but none were injured. Two men in the caboose of the work train were injured, one of them, Bert Willard, of Cottage Grove, quite severely, but not seriously. The men in the caboose, seeing the approaching train, jumped from the cupola of the car before it struck or they might have been killed outright.

The wreck delayed passenger traffic till this morning, the flyer coming through Eugene at 8:30 o'clock. The Cottage Grove local followed ten minutes later and No. 16 arrived at 9 o'clock, stopping here for breakfast.

The conductor on the work train is said to have forgotten his orders, that being the cause ascribed for the collision.

TRIMMING SHADE TREES.

Notice to Owners
All property owners must within 15 days from notice hereof cause all shade trees in front of their premises and on their premises overhanging the street, to be trimmed to a height of not less than fifteen feet, so as to afford to travelers an unobstructed view of street lights, or be subject, for failure to do so after notice, to a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$20.
