DIFFICULTIES IN SPRINGFIELD SEWER WORK

C. G. McClain and J. W. McArthur, of Eugene, who have begun work on their contract of building a sewer system for the city of Springfield, have already struck some difficulties in that their first ditches have filled with water, making the work of digging them below a three-foot level difficult. The contractors expect to avoid this trouble when they get their main trench, which will in places be nine feet deep, dug to the river. Through this all the lateral trenches will be drained. The reason that the trenches fill with water is that Springfield is on a level with the Booth-Kelly mill pond and the soil is very porous. How long it will take the contractors to finish their job will depend upon the number of men they can employ, for according to the present number of laborers it will take all summer. On the laterals, which are four feet deep, the men are paid twenty-five cents a yard. However, laborers can hardly be got at any price.

SUNDAY'S GAME WILL BE BATTLE ROYAL

Both ladies jumped out to reach the horses, but this only added to their terror and the team dashed away with the little child in the wagon. It is supposed the child was jolted out as the team ran for about four miles without injury to the wagon or harness. The little girl was found unconscious. Medical aid was quickly summoned but she was beyond help and she died during the afternoon without regaining consciousness. The body was brought over here and taken home the same evening and was interred Thursday. Junction City Times.

SURVEY TO BE COMPLETED IN A SHORT TIME

Silver Lake, Or., June 12.—The Oregon Short Line surveyors who are surveying the route for the Oregon Eastern from Ontario to Natron, will finish location work this month to Odell, where the Southern Pacific surveyors are doing location work across the mountains. The line located is on an 8-10 grade from Crane Creek gap to Odell, and is the best route that could be found by five of the best engineers the Oregon Short Line officials could put in the field. There the three lines being surveyed to Lakeview. One leaves the main line near Narrows, Harney county, and passes through the rich valleys of Catlow and Warner to Lakeview. The second line is being surveyed from Iron mountain south through the desert to Lake Valley, then into California. The third leaves the main line near Christmas Lake, passing through the central part of Christmas Lake valley, which is one of the largest unsettled valleys in eastern Oregon, and contains thousands of acres of agricultural land; then into Summer Lake valley, another fine valley waiting for the coming of a railroad. In this valley people have made a success of raising grain and fruit, which goes to show that what can be raised in other valleys as climate, soil and elevation are all about the same. It then goes into the Goose Lake country to Lakeview.
