REFERENDUM POINTS UNDER ARGUMENT

Salem, Ore., June 24.—The State's demurrer to the mandamus proceeding to compel the Secretary of State to accept and place on file the petition for the referendum of the State University appropriation act, which was rejected on the advice of the Attorney-General, to the effect that the petition was not a complete title of the act passed by the Legislature; the demurrers to the injunction proceedings attacking the validity of the Multnomah County Sheriff's act, brought by Sheriff Stevens, and the Freeman compulsory pass act, brought by Attorney John F. Logan, because of the omission of the warning clause from petitions, are being argued before Judge Galloway of the Circuit Court this afternoon.

Considerable sparring is being indulged in between counsel for the petitioners for the referendum of the University appropriation act, Tilmon Ford and M. E. Pogue, and counsel for the University alumni, Judge William P. Lord and G. G. Bingham, upon the question of permitting the pleading of the omission of the warning clause from the petition, which was not raised by the complaint, and which the petitioners' counsel are striving to avoid, but the question has already been injected into the case in the defendant's answer to the complaint.

Counsel for petitioners are striving to shift the responsibility for the defect in the title of the act, as stated in the petitions, to the shoulders of the clerks in the office of the Secretary of State, upon the ground that the copies of the measures were furnished to the agents of the petitioners by that department. In reply to this contention, which does not operate as a legal excuse for the defect in the title, Chief Clerk Koser says that at no time was the office called upon to furnish other than copies of the numerous appropriation "bills" and not certified copies of the acts, and that no intimation was

Malarky, of Portland, represent the contestants of the petitions for the sheriff's and compulsory pass acts in their, the injunction cases, and Multnomah, is here to defend the attack made upon the Sheriff's act. Sheriff Stevens is also present at the hearing as plaintiff in the latter suit. It is stated that it makes no difference whether or not the question of the omission of the warning clause from the university petition is allowed to enter into the mandamus proceeding if the petitions for the other acts are thrown out upon this point since the same question can be raised through an injunction suit in the university act case later on. The validity of the petition for the referendum of the National Guard Armories appropriation act is also involved in these suits.
