The railroad surveyors are at work near Hazel Dell locating. They expect to be reinforced by another crew soon after the Fourth.

A game of baseball between the Florence and Glenade boys last Sunday resulted in a score of 16 to 2 in favor of Florence. Only five innings were played.

School election in Mapleton was a very quiet affair. A. A. Hollenbeck was re-elected director, and Jos Morris, Jr., clerk. A tax of five mills was voted which will raise about \$220. The state and county funds with this will reach \$480, so Mapleton will have the full nine months' school.

The Siuslaw Lumber Co.'s mill at Acme was shut down indefinitely a couple of weeks ago, but started sawing again today. The company have received several good orders and the mill will probably run steady for some time. NOTICE TO SHEEP OWNERS

The new sheep inspection law requires that all sheep in Oregon shall be dipped by August 1, 1907. Any sheep not dipped at that date must be seized and dipped at the owner's risk.

Owners can save expense by clubbing together and using the same vats and corrals. Any standard sulphur and lime or sulphur, lime and tobacco dip may be used, but must be prepared and used under the supervision of a state or federal officer; and no other dipping will be recognized. Where tobacco dip is used, 16 pounds of sulphur must be added to 100 gallons of prepared dip.

After the vat is sufficiently filled, one-half gallon of dip will be required for each sheep—that is, with good drainage. Lambs must be dipped.

Any persons who hinders or obstructs a deputy in the performance of his duty subjects himself to a fine of from \$100 to \$500.

All deputies are under bonds and are instructed to enforce the law to the letter.

Any owner or owners wishing to arrange a test case should communicate with Dr. W. H. Lytle, Pendleton, Oregon. Such tests have been won by other states.
