SENTENCE OF SCHMITZ GOES OVER TO JULY 8

San Francisco, June 27.—The sentence of Mayor Eugene E. Schmitz, convicted of extortion, was today postponed to July 8. The postponement was granted over the angry protests of the attorneys for the defense who insisted on immediate sentence of their client in order to permit him to appeal to a higher court for a new trial. The mayor will have to spend twelve more days in jail before applying to the higher court for bail on

the strength of his appeal for a new trial. The postponement was granted on the statement of District Attorney Langdon that on July 8 the prosecution will be ready to say whether or not the other extortion charges pending against the mayor would be prosecuted. Judge Dunne having intimated that the sentence would be less severe if the other prosecutions were to be abandoned.

STANDARD OIL MAGNATES MUST APPEAR IN COURT

Chicago, June 27. Subpoenas were issued today in the United States district court for the leading officers of the Standard Oil Co. of Indiana. The officials summoned include John D. Rockefeller, William Rockefeller, John D. Archibald, Henry H. Rogers, W. H. Tilford, C. M. Pratt and others of the parent concern and A. J. Moffett, president, W. P. Cowan, vice-president and other officers of the Indiana company.

The issuance of the subpoenas is the direct result of the refusal of the

attorneys of the Standard Oil company yesterday to inform the court of the financial condition of the Indiana company. Judge Landis replied he was entitled to that information in connection with the imposing of fines and intended to have it.

The Standard Oil company of Indiana was indicted and found guilty on sixty-two counts of using the illegal freight rates tendered it by the Chicago & Alton road.
