**PEOPLE READY
TO HELP BUILD
SIUSLAW ROAD**

Eugene, Or., June 28.—Editor Guard: Understanding that some of Eugene's most energetic and influential business men and a few eastern capitalists are considering a proposition to construct a railroad from Eugene to tidewater on the Siuslaw river, we would like to offer a few suggestions as to what we think would be the most practicable and shortest route to salt water from Eugene. We have no desire to misrepresent in the least to get things coming our way—we have been a resident of the famous wild cat timber belt for the past 20 years, and have seen two surveys made from Eugene to tidewater, and have, therefore, thought and studied quite a lot on the different routes and passes over the mountains to the coast. And if it is the desire of the promoters to build through a fine fruit raising and dairy country, and reach "big" timber at the nearest place, then we would suggest the following route as the shortest, quickest and easiest, with the lowest pass and fewest hills:

Coming west from Eugene through the Powell Gap, striking Coyote creek near Llewellyn, thence up that stream past the Jenkins and Liles places, thence up a branch by Crow, and on over a low ridge onto Notli, and then an easy grade to Wild Cat, then on down hill to tidewater.

Big timber will be plentiful when Crow and Notli are reached and the people will be anxious and willing to assist all in their power and means to secure a road over that route.

These are only suggestions. We will hail with gladness a railroad over any of the routes to the bay and we cordially invite any or all of the promoters to come over our suggested route and see for themselves how things look. In our estimation Eugene will make a great mistake if it fails to secure the road.

LIKE DAVID AND URIAH.

Doctor Sends Sweetheart's Husband Away For His Health.

Charging that Dr. Wallace W. Colby of 717 Halsey street, Brooklyn, a physician with an extensive practice among the staid and well to do folk of the Stuyvesant section of that borough, had prescribed for Robert A. Brown a long western trip, during which Dr. Colby alienated the affections of Brown's wife, Brown's lawyers started action in the supreme court in Kings county, seeking to recover \$25,000 damages from the physician. Dr. Colby forthwith filed a denial of everything.

In March, 1904, so the affidavit recites, the physician decided that Brown needed a change of air. It was necessary for Brown to go far away from the polluted atmosphere of Brooklyn and stay away a long time, so Brown avers the doctor said. Indeed Dr. Colby suggested Colorado as an appropriate place for Brown to regain his health, the complainant said, and to Colorado went Brown, leaving Mrs. Brown behind. Brown was gone until August, 1905, and it was during his absence, so he alleges, that the affections of his wife were alienated by Dr. Colby.

Mrs. Brown, it is alleged, did not greet her husband as affectionately when he returned as he expected she would. Subsequently continued coldness on the part of his wife, Brown says, induced him to start an investigation that led to his bringing suit against the physician.

Dr. Colby's answer to the complaint was contained in a dozen typewritten lines, in which he flatly denied each allegation made against him. Dr. Colby is about thirty-five years old and is said to enjoy the confidence of the community in which he practices.

WHALE UNDER THE BOAT.

Cetacean Gives Atlantic City Sailing Party a Bad Scare.

Twenty-five persons who composed a sailing party on the pleasure yacht Maude E., Captain William Somers, narrowly escaped death when the big sloop hit a hundred foot whale eight miles off Atlantic City, N. J. For an hour the passengers had been watching the whale, which was sporting near the craft, when suddenly it dived and came up under the boat. With a lash of its giant tail it broke the centerboard, dismantled the rigging and left the boat leaking badly. Only the efforts of the men prevented several of the panic stricken women passengers from leaping into the sea.

Several of the passengers were from Philadelphia and Washington, but with the exception of Albert Bell of the Quaker City their names could not be learned. They hurried to their hotels as soon as the disabled boat reached the wharf. Among those on board

were Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Watts and son, Wilfrid Watts, and Mrs. William J. Boehler of Brookfield, Conn. All of them were still suffering from the shock of their experience when seen at their hotel.

"The whale was the largest I have ever seen in these waters," said Captain Somers. "We thought it was not dangerous until it dived and came up under our craft, lashing the sea into foam and drenching the passengers as it spouted water as high as our mast-head. One lash from the whale's tail broke our heavy centerboard of iron and oak, thus leaving us badly crippled."

DIED TO SAVE TEDDY BEAR.

Tragic Fate of Two-year-old Admirer of President Roosevelt.

Drowned in a tub of water while trying to rescue her "Teddy bear" was the tragic ending to the life of little two-year-old Marie Huber at her home, 4711 Edgemont street, Philadelphia.

The child was innocently playing with "Teddy Roosevelt" in the kitchen, where stood a tub of water filled to the brim. Her mother was busy in another part of the house.

While fondling the stuffed bear it fell from Marie's arms and landed in the tub. It sank to the bottom, and the child started to cry.

Then the little girl conceived the idea of rescuing her precious possession and tried to reach for it in the tub. Somehow she lost her balance and fell in after the "Teddy bear." A few minutes later her mother, returning to the kitchen, found her child lying unconscious at the bottom of the tub. Physicians did everything to revive the girl, but life was extinct.
