WORK BEGINS ON WILLAMETTE STREET CURBING

Men in the employ of the Warren Construction Company this morning began the work of building the curb along the sidewalks on Willamette street preparatory to paving. The curbing will extend two feet further out than the sidewalks do now, and the property owners will have to fill in the space between the edge of the walks and the curbing with cement, making the sidewalks twelve feet wide instead of ten, as at present. The work has begun at the depot end of the street. The paving work will perhaps commence some time next week, although there is no definite information to that effect.

GOVERNOR ENDORSES NAVAL BOARD ACTION

Salem, July 9.—Governor Chamberlain this morning received the following telegram from the New York World:

"The World would deeply appreciate from you an expression of opinion concerning the plan to mobilize an American battleship fleet in the Pacific, and the view the Japanese nation would be justified in taking of the move. As this is our request a telegraphic reply as desired should be at our expense."

Governor Chamberlain sent the following reply, which is in accordance with the views expressed in his Jacksonville Fourth of July speech, where he eulogized the Roosevelt administration:

"The plan to mobilize American battleships in the Pacific meets with my approval. I know not what view the Japanese nation would take of this movement, and I care less. Do not think their opinion should be consulted, but believe this government should act for its own protection without consulting the views of any other nation."

Biggs, formerly United States commissioner at Prineville, who was convicted in the federal court of conspiracy to suborn perjury, was locked up in the county jail this morning, to serve a sentence of ten months imprisonment. Biggs asked to have the order changed so that he could serve his sentence in the Crook county jail, near his farm, but Judge W. J. Worton refused to disturb the previous order entered by Judge Hunt, and so the convicted man will have to remain in the custody of Sheriff Stevens.—Portland Telegram.

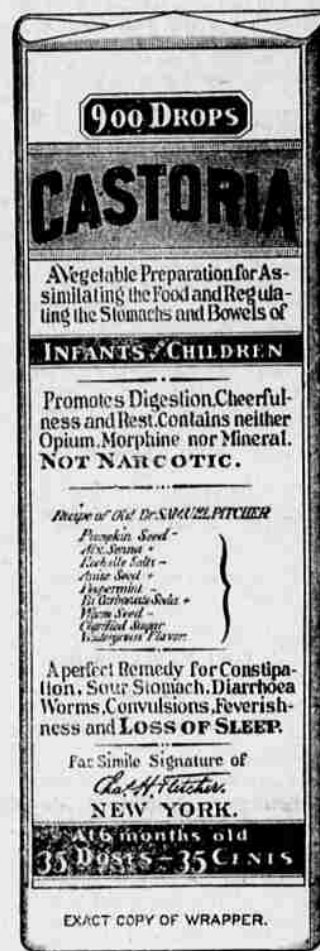
