TRACK LAYING BEGINS ON STREET RAILWAY LINE

TIES AND RAILS LAID FROM THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC DEPOT GROUNDS TO FIFTH STREET TODAY

Standard Gauge Track Over Which Cars From Any Part of Proposed System to Be Built Can Run. First Spike Driven This Morning Without Ceremony.

The work of laying the track for the street railway line was begun this morning and that portion of the track between the depot grounds and Fifth street was finished. It begins to look now like a railroad and a genuine one at that. The track is standard gauge and will be a part of the system which the company says it will build in this county. Cars from the McAnzies line or any other line which the company may build can be operated over the lines in the city. The driving of the first spike was done without any ceremony. The building of the line is not a matter of sentiment with the company; it is business with them.

The ordinance granting the company the franchise to build the line provides that only two blocks of the street shall be torn up at a time, and in compliance the track will be laid to Sixth street before the big blow is put to work again.

The usual big crowd of men watched operations all day today. The work is attracting a great deal of attention from passengers on the trains and is a good advertisement for the city. When the railway and the pavement are completed they will attract a great deal more attention than now, a still greater advertisement.

CARTER CO. VICTORIOUS

U. S. Court Says It is Exclusively Entitled to Red Package for Pills.

The Carter Medicine Company, of New York, states that its exclusive right as owner of Little Liver Pills to the red package has been again confirmed by two important decrees of the United States court sitting at Trenton. It says: "The suit of the Carter Medicine Company in that court for an injunction to restrain a Camden, N. J., pill manufacturer from using a red colored package for his preparation is decided in favor of the Carter Company. A similar result occurs in a suit to enjoin a retail druggist from selling pills in red packages. "The court decides that the Carter Medicine Company has for many years had the sole and exclusive right to the use of red-colored wrappers and labels upon small round packages of liver pills, and says that the right was acquired by backdating from using a red colored package for his preparation is decided in favor of the Carter Company. A similar result occurs in a suit to enjoin a retail druggist from selling pills in red packages, except the genuine Carter's."

"The decrees direct the defendants, among other things, to deliver up to the Carter Company for destruction all infringing wrappers, packages, bottles, etc. The defendants are required to account to the complainant and to pay the damages found due, as well as the costs of the action."

ELOPEMENT STOPPED BY THEFT CHARGE

Man Named Vickers in Roseburg Jail Awaiting Trial—Farmer Williams' Home Broken Up. Roseburg, Or., July 16.—S. Vickers, who has of late been employed at the livery barn of S. T. Smith at this place, is in jail on a charge of having stolen a sum of money from his employer. By his arrest, it is said, an elopement plan was frustrated.

According to all the allegations in the case, Vickers had won the affections of the wife of a well-to-do Looking Glass farmer, G. T. B. Williams. Their plans for an elopement were spoiled at the eleventh hour, when it was discovered that Vickers had stolen some money from Smith, who gave away the secret of the eloping couple's affection to Williams, Smith and Deputy Sheriff F. G. Stewart.
