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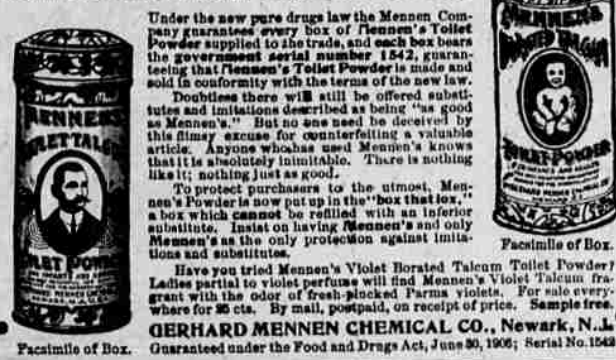

SABBATH DAY IS DISCUSSED AT LOWELL

(Special Correspondence.)
Lowell, July 18.—Thomas Crayle, of Lebanon, and wife are looking after their farm near the Middle Fork school house.
On Sunday, the 14th inst., at the Rush Island school house, Mr. Sharp, Methodist Sunday school superintendent, and Mr. Sprague, Seventh Day Adventist, had a lively discussion about the fourth commandment. Mr. Sharp argued that the Christian Sabbath needed no argument to sustain it; that it was ushered into existence at the resurrection of Christ; that it had been observed by Christians and taught wherever the gospel or Christ was preached and denied that the constance of the Catholic church had anything to do with the change from the seventh to the first day, and that God only was holy, not a day, and that the Hebrew Sabbath was buried in the ruins of the dark ages and had ceased to be observed by Christians and would never again be resurrected. Mr. Sprague argued that the seventh day was the Sabbath of the Bible; that God had made it the holy Sabbath; that the statement of the dark ages was all bosh; that the constance of the Catholic church made the change; and that the Christian Sabbath, or Sunday, was not observed by the apostles. HARRISBURG NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Dr. T. C. Mackey was at Eugene on a short business visit last Wednesday evening.

Miss Millie Peters was down from Eugene on a short visit with friends last Friday afternoon.

M. C. Bond, of Coburg, was here a short time Monday evening on a business trip. Mr. Bond is now one of the members of the Coburg Mercantile Company, and reports business very good at the sawmill city. Mr. Bond was in the employ of the S. P. Co. as station agent for fourteen years.

Mr. and Mrs. James Bailey, of Junction City, were here the latter part of last week visiting with relatives. They have disposed of their property in Junction and left here Saturday evening for Los Angeles, where they will reside in the future. They take with them the best wishes of a host of friends in this section.

Silas Leonard, of Coburg, who has been ill in this city for several weeks past, died Monday shortly after noon and the funeral services were conducted at the M. E. church, south Tuesday afternoon, his remains being laid to rest in the Lewis cemetery north of Coburg. The services at the cemetery were conducted by the Harrisburg and Coburg Odd Fellows and Rebekah lodges, he having been a member of both organizations. The services were largely attended. Deceased leaves a wife and two sons, besides a number of other relatives and a host of friends, all of whom deeply sympathize with the surviving relatives in their sad loss.

He stated that he received money from a sister, but he was never known to get a letter while here and never had a check or draft cashed. He would sometimes go away and be gone a week or so and most generally had plenty of money upon his return. He was quite a hand to dispose of red liquor and stated that he allowed himself \$1 per day for booze, and as he always bought it by the quart this would indicate that he put away about seven quarts a week. It is now supposed that while he lived here he would go away and perhaps hold up some one or crack a safe and then return here until the smoke blew away. He was a good talker and had a good many yarns to relate, but none of our people ever thought of him as a hot-up artist. There is a bare possibility that he may have had a hand in cracking the S. P. safe some months ago. No one would put it past him now that his record has become known.—Bulletin.

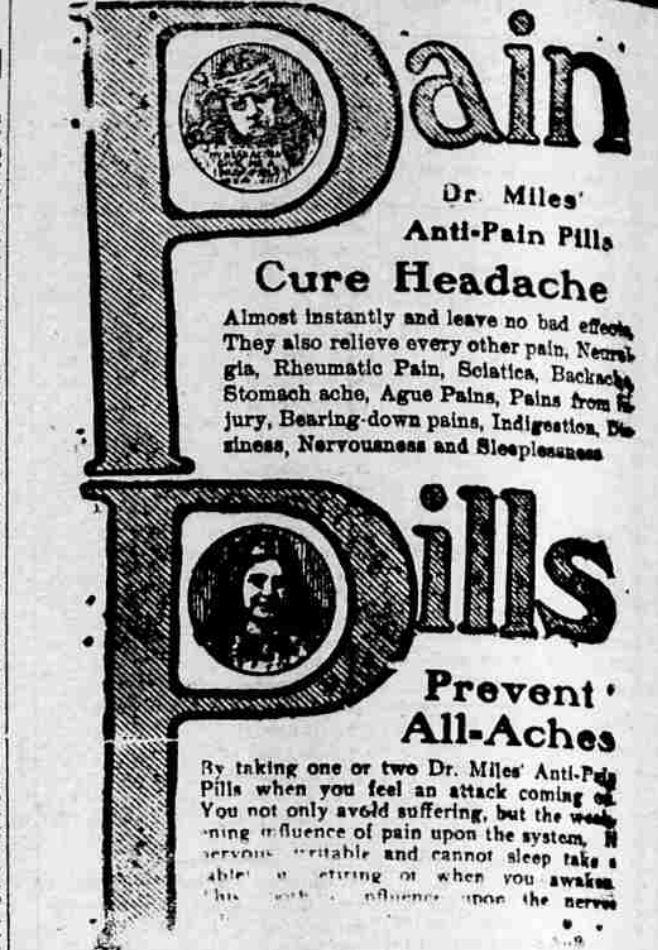
