STREET RAILWAY AND PAVING WORK IS PROGRESSING

The work of building the street car line as far south as Sixth street will have been entirely completed by tonight. Foreman Utterback gets a lot of work out of the small force he has and they have done well to do as much as they have since they began on the line. It has been necessary to go a foot and more below the surface of the hard gravel street for the track and this has been slow work. That portion of the work was completed to Sixth street by noon today and then the ties and rails were laid and the men put to work surfacing up the track as far as it was laid.
