CLOSED SEASON FOR SETTING OUT FIRES IS ON

Now that the closed season for setting fires throughout the state is on, county clerks everywhere are receiving numerous applications for permits to burn slashings, rubbish and other materials which it is usually the desire to destroy during the summer season. Lane residents have commenced to apply to the county clerk's office for permits, not being aware that the last session of the Oregon legislature passed a bill repealing the old law whereby the clerk should issue fire permits, and passed a law creating a state board of forestry, which has supervision over matters of this kind.

According to the provisions of the law lately enacted the state board of forestry is composed of the governor, secretary of state, the state forest fish and game warden, the member of the Oregon Agricultural College who has charge of its forest work, and three electors of the state of Oregon to be appointed by the governor from and upon the recommendation of the Lumber Manufacturers' Association of Oregon, Oregon Forestry Association, and the United States forest service, each to select one of such electors.

The board of forestry appoints the deputy fire warden throughout the state upon the recommendation of property owners or counties. The expenses of the deputy fire warden are borne by the property owners or counties over which they have jurisdiction.

Under the old law which gave the county clerks authority to issue fire permits, conditions were very often unsatisfactory. The clerk in a large proportion of cases did not know the conditions when he issued a fire permit, and in a number of instances the permission was granted inadvisedly. The old law made it necessary for the person to whom the fire permit was issued to wait ten days before setting fire to what he desired to destroy. The closed season for the setting of fires is from the first of June to October first.

LIONEL STAGGE AGAIN IN TROUBLE

New York, July 23.—Lionel Stagge, alias Villard, was arrested last night on Broadway, two indictments, one for forgery in the second degree and the other for grand larceny, having been filed against him. Stagge, who was once United States bank examiner on the Pacific Coast, has been in trouble here before. In 1901 he was held here on a charge of embezzlement and jumped his bail. In 1903 he was arrested in Washington on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. He was discharged after promising to leave town.

He was in jail in Oregon for a year, after conviction for forgery in 1888. He got out of jail in Baltimore lately, having been convicted, three of swindling. He has been posing as a magazine writer and asking prominent men to give him considerable sums of money for writing complimentary accounts of their lives. He is accused of forging the name of Homer Davenport, the cartoonist.

Stagge was at one time married to a Eugene girl, but they have been divorced several years.

WORK STARTS ON SHAFT AT COAL MINE

CONTRACTOR WILL BEGIN DIGGING INTO EARTH TOMORROW AND EXPECTS TO HAVE SHAFT COMPLETED WITHIN THREE MONTHS.

C. W. Sloan, of this city, who has been awarded the contract by the Spencer Butte Coal and Petroleum company to sink a shaft at the mine southwest of the city, will begin the work tomorrow. He will be associated in the work with G. M. Ely. They expect to have the shaft, which will go down 175 feet, completed in less than three months. They will work a double shift, putting on a force of men at work at night as well as in the daytime. The shaft will be five to seven feet in diameter and will be constructed in a scientific manner. Messrs Sloan and Ely are experienced miners, having spent many years in the Bohemia district, and this fact insures good work.

President Zimmerman, of the company, who stuck to the coal mine proposition through thick and thin, confidently believes that he will be able to supply Eugene with a good quality of fuel this winter. The vein recently encountered by the drill seems to be very thick and promises to be wide in extent.

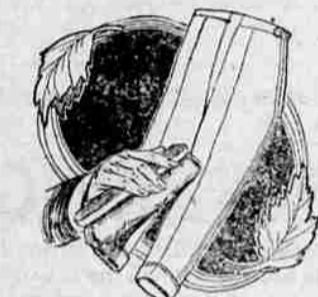
