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HOP CONTRACTS NUMEROUS IN MARION COUNTY

The hops in many of the yards in this vicinity are in bloom and this is a sign that the picking season is but five or six weeks away. From the country in and about Gervais and Woodburn it is learned that the crop will be a little lighter than a year ago. The old yards are not showing up as well as in past years, but the younger yards are thriving, says the Salem, Or., Statesman.

A number of hop contracts, most of them at 12 cents, have been placed on file with the Marion county recorder.

The following are extracts taken from the various exchanges:

The Osego Republican, July 17.
There is no change in the hop market. The condition of the yards has not changed much. There will be some good and many light yards. Some good judges say the crop will be two-thirds that of last year.

New York Journal of Commerce-Bulletin, July 13.

Yesterday's market was quiet, but sales have been made here recently at prices ranging from 9 1/2 to 11c, according to quality. Cables from England estimate the crop at from 280,000 to 300,000 cwt. and report cold weather.

New York Produce Price-Current, July 13.

The local market has shown some activity the past few days, between 400 and 500 bales of Oregon hops having been sold on a basis of 9 1/2 to 10c, and one small lot brought 11c. This latter price was exceptional, and simply paid because the buyer had to have the lot. On the coast some business is reported on the basis of 6 to 7c, according to quality, with growers showing more disposition to dispose of their 1906 holdings. The crop reports from the coast continue excellent, especially from Oregon and Washington, and while the California reports are very good it is claimed that they cannot raise as large a crop as last season. The New York state yards continue to grow slowly, and it is now generally conceded that it will be impossible to raise over 75 per cent of the 1906 crop. The vines, however, are in excellent condition, strong and well cultivated, and entirely free from vermin. The reports from England are not so good, their crop being very backward on account of bad weather conditions, and they also complain of vermin.

Continental crops are reported to be in excellent shape. Growers on the coast are showing more disposition to contract the growing crop at 10c, a great many contracts having been written.

New York Tribune-Farmer, July 11.

The market has shown little if any change unless it is that the tone has shown a little more tendency to weakness. The excellent crop prospects in all the hop growing sections have caused a little more anxiety to sell, and we hear of poor Washington hops having sold as low as 3c, and 7c is now the top for the very choicest lots left in Oregon. Some inferior Washingtons have sold on the local market at 6 to 7c. Favorable weather, with occasional rains, has caused good progress in the vines in all sections, and conditions are all that could be asked for. In England the much-needed rains have arrived, and estimates are now making as high as 400,000 cwt., and as low as 350,000 cwt., for the coming crop. Germany continues to report good progress in all growing sections.

Waterville Times, July 12.

In spite of the severe storms that have raged about us, the hop yards in this immediate vicinity are looking well. Several good rains have benefited the yards this week and everything is looking forward to a fairly good harvest if nothing new turns up to prevent.

Cobleskill Times, July 11.

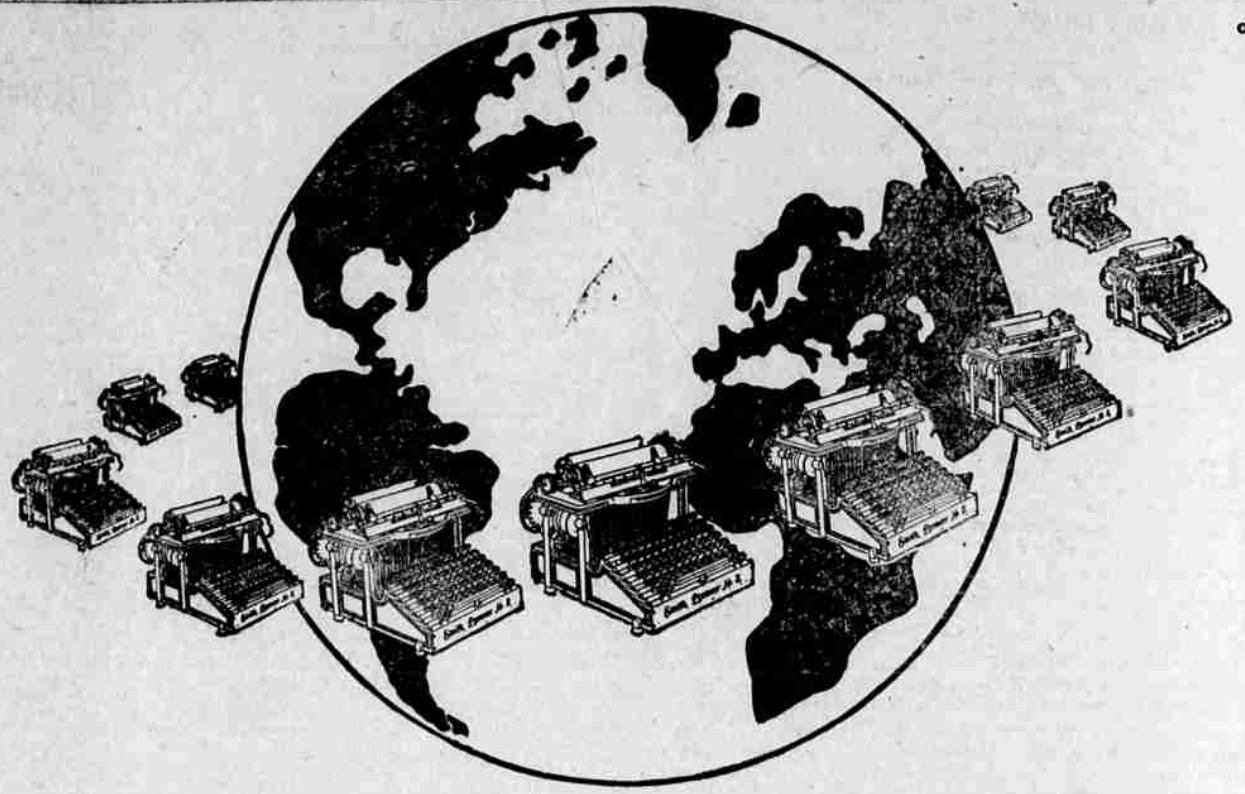
During the past few weeks yards in this vicinity have greatly improved in appearance and some present a very bushy growth. Chas. A. Weiting and Franco Bros. have two of the finest yards to be seen. The damage by the late spring has affected the majority of yards and the crop is estimated to be a very short yield.

Schoharie Republican, July 11.

Favorable weather has continued the past week and the vines show an excellent growth. It is noted, however, that the arms are not so numerous as usual, and as the time for the hop "blow" is at hand, it is evident that but a small crop can be grown this year in this and other hop growing counties in New York state. A Waterville dispatch to the Utica Observer says: "This vicinity was visited about 6 o'clock last evening by a very severe rainstorm, accompanied by some wind and hail, but no particular damage was done here so far as reported, while on the other hand the rain did an incalculable amount of benefit to crops of all kinds. North of here, however, and in the town of Marshall, the hail storm was quite severe, while the wind which accompanied the storm was very heavy, and as a result considerable damage was done to hops and some other crops which were in the line of the storm. The hop crop has been cutting on in fine shape for the past few weeks, and the yards were presenting a fine appearance, and this hail necessarily cut off many of the heads of the vines and the result will be that the growth will be seriously retarded. Reports indicate that the heaviest portion of the storm manifested itself near Deansboro, between that village and Waterville, where the fall of hail was especially heavy."

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
