The bombardment began in the sixth when Keene, Coburg's twirler, seemed to let down. In that inning two runs were netted and in the seventh three more. Chick, who has practiced with the Eugene Colts, then relieved Keene, and with two or three hits off of him and a big bunch of errors seven runs crossed the rubber in the eight and last inning for the Blues.

Coburg in the second inning got their lone tally by a couple of hits, one a successful bunt, and two men who were hit by Tallafero.

Tallafero showed splendid form, as did most of his team mates. Coburg had some changes in her lineup, which seemed to brought over her a great hoodoo. The score:

FOURTH REGIMENT, O. N. G., HAS BEEN FORMED

ORGANIZATION TOOK PLACE AT ROSEBURG SATURDAY NIGHT AND MAJOR GEO. O. YORAN ELECTED COLONEL

Seven Old Companies and One to Be Organized to Form New Regiment. Williams Will Probably Be Appointed Lieutenant Colonel and Hammond and Hamlin Majors

The Fourth regiment of the Oregon National Guard was formed Saturday evening at the Roseburg encampment, and Major Geo. O. Yoran of the First Separate Battalion was elected colonel.

The appointive officers were not chosen, but commissions will probably soon be issued for a lieutenant-colonel, two majors of the battalion, a regimental adjutant, a regimental commissary, a regimental quartermaster and two battalion adjutants. Captain J. M. Williams, of Company C, Eugene, is said to be the most likely candidate for lieutenant-colonel, and Captain C. C. Hammond, of Company A, Eugene, and Captain F. B. Hamlin, of Company D, of Roseburg, for majors. Lieutenant F. L. Chambers, quartermaster-commissary, of Eugene, will also probably have his pick of the three regimental positions in his line. The other positions will probably be promotions, which in turn will leave openings for a number of non-commissioned officers to become commissioned.

The companies at Roseburg were H, of Ashland, D, of Roseburg, E, of Cottage Grove, F, of McMinnville, and G, of Albany. Other companies in the new companies will be A and C of Eugene, and a new one to be formed.

Company K, 3rd, Wins Shoot. Company K, of Portland, won the team rifle shoot with a score of 486 out of a possible 600, and will hold the state trophy, which is in possession of Company D, of Roseburg. By the conditions of the shoot, in order to gain ownership of the cup a company must win it three times in succession. Ben Shields, of Roseburg, won the individual medal for the best score in the team shoot. He also won last year.

Saturday the individual contests were begun. Teams are there from every company in the state with the exception of one or two. Shields is reported to have made a "possible" score of 50 in 50 Saturday in the rapid fire contest. The various individual matches will probably be finished today, and in that case the Eugene teams will return tomorrow.
