## JAMES SANFORD WILL ERECT BRICK BLOCK

**TWO-STORY HOTEL BUILDING MAY STAND WHERE OREGON HOTEL IS BY THIS TIME NEXT YEAR**  
Construction Work Is Expected to Begin Next March—Building Will Be Eighty by Ninety Feet in Dimensions—Will Be Great Improvement to That Section

James Sanford, the well-known pioneer, unless his health breaks down, expects to build next year on his property on Willamette street, between Sixth and Seventh streets where the Oregon Hotel is, a large two-story brick building. The property is very valuable, and the new structure will be a great improvement in that block. Construction will probably begin about March, and the work will be pushed as rapidly as possible.

It is not definitely settled in Mr. Sanford's mind just what the character of the building will be, but it is likely that part of the first floor and the upper story will be completed as a hotel, and that the remainder of the store rooms will be occupied by business people.

The building will have an eighty foot front and will extend back ninety feet. Mr. Sanford owns to the alley, 180 feet. The land is at the present time occupied by several old one-story buildings used as a hotel, barber shop and cigar store.

## L. N. RONEY AWARDED LOWELL BRIDGE CONTRACT

The county commissioners' court met in special session this morning for the purpose of opening the bids for the construction of the county bridge across the Willamette river at Lowell. There was only one bid, that of L. N. Roney, and the contract was let to him, the bond being signed this afternoon. Mr. Roney's bid was \$6255. He will at once begin the work on the structure, and will have it finished before the fall rains set in. The bridge will be a covered wooden structure of the Howe truss design, and located about half a mile above the old ferry which has been the only means of crossing the river at that point for many years.
