LOS ANGELES-PORTLAND SEVENTY-SEVEN HOURS

D. L. Burke, Automobilist, Who Passed Through Eugene, Makes Record Coast Trip.

D. L. Burke, the Los Angeles real estate dealer and automobilist, who passed through Eugene the other day, has arrived at Portland, completing the entire coast trip from Los Angeles to Portland in record time. Concerning his trip, the Portland Telegram says:

"The first official running time ever recorded for an automobile between Los Angeles and Portland is that kept by D. L. Burke, a wealthy real estate man of the former city, who arrived in Portland in his Pope-Hartford touring car last night. He kept a record of actual time consumed in the trip between the two cities, and it was exactly 77 hours. Under favorable conditions of weather and roads Burke says the trip ought to be made in 50 hours. This sounds remarkable in view of the fact that the distance by rail is about 1260 miles, two large mountain ranges have to be crossed and the route by road is from 20 to 25 per cent farther than by rail.

While Burke's actual running time will not have official standing as a record, it will without question be accepted as a mark which future motor car tourists will attempt to lower.

Mr. Burke said the worst roads between Los Angeles and Portland are between Salem and Oregon City, where the dust is a foot deep and chuckholes every four feet.

After a week in Portland, Mr. and Mrs. Burke will continue their way to Seattle for a short stay.

WOODS CHARGE BY WIRE TO DELMAS

Boise, Idaho, Aug. 1.—D. M. Delmas, the celebrated attorney who is defending Glass and others at San Francisco who are charged with bribing the supervisors of that city, a conspiracy case, wired the county clerk of this county to send him by wire a copy of the instructions given the jury in the Haywood case by Judge Wood. It was sent, and the telephone toll amounted to \$360. The laws of Idaho and California are the same relative to a conspiracy, and Delmas evidently hoped there might be matter in the instructions that he could use in behalf of his clients.

BOY FALLS INTO VAT OF BOILING LIQUID AT ALBANY

While playing in the Albany Tanning Company's plant yesterday afternoon Charlie Marovich, aged eight years, accidentally slipped and fell into the vat of boiling liquid used for tanning hides and was nearly scalded to death. The lad is a summoned workman from nearby who pulled him from the burning liquid. He was removed to the home of his grandfather, John Olvis, where he received medical attention. The lad resides with his grandparents. Mr. Olvis is an employee of the tannery and his grandson was playing around the place when he fell into the tanning vat. The youth sustained terrible burns, but will probably recover. Had he not been rescued from the vat at once the youth would in all probability have been burned alive.—Herald.
