MARCOLA IS VERY BUSY PLACE THIS SUMMER

W. W. Coffey Hurt Again—Wedding Anniversary—Southern Pacific Lumber Flume from Camp No. 2 Nearing Completion.

The third flume into Marcola, from Southern Pacific camp No. 2, will be finished within a couple of weeks, according to the estimate of the foreman. They are now at the crossing of the Fischer flume. Several months have been spent upon the work, which has entailed a considerable expense. The flume is fifty feet high in some places, the end of it coming into the same yard as the one from No. 3, they entering from nearly opposite directions.

The hotel which has been constructed by C. Cole will be ready for opening in about ten days. The building is a three-story frame structure, containing 32 rooms. W. C. Seelye will be manager of the establishment, which has been greatly needed in the thriving town of Marcola.

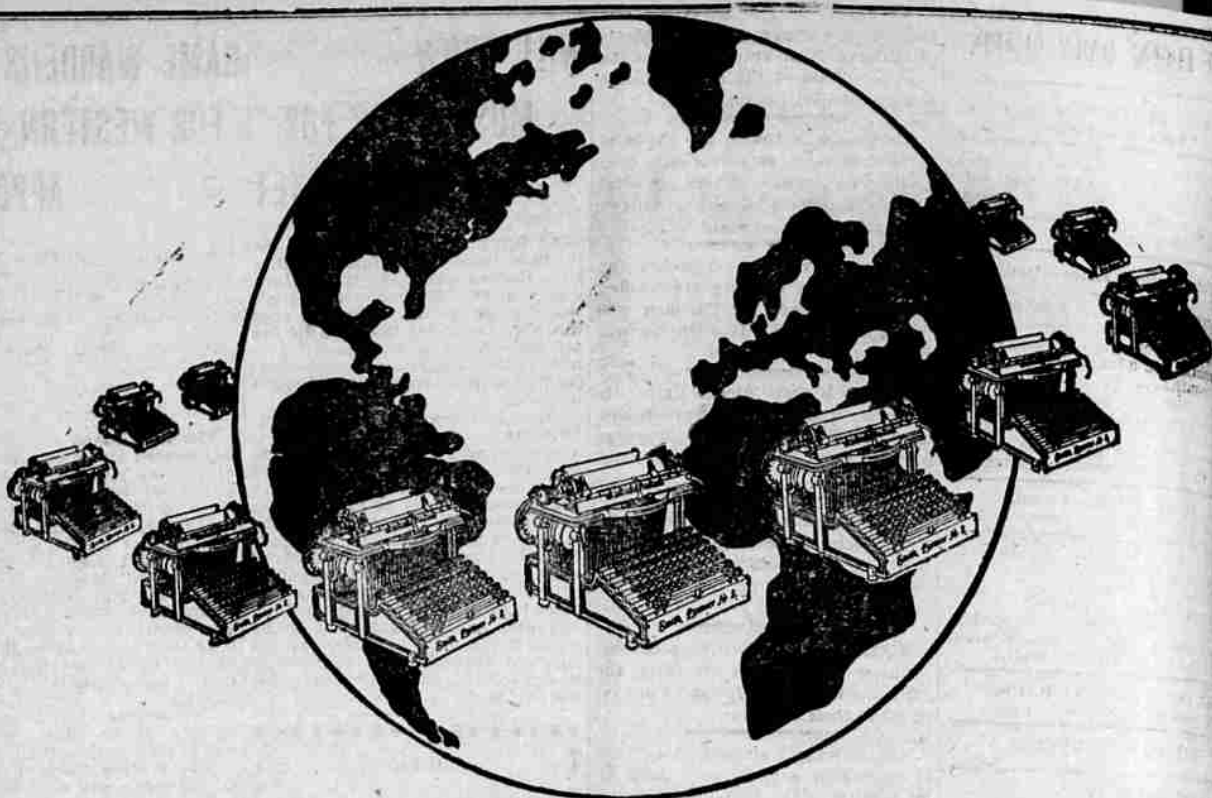
