J. W. Zimmerman, of the Spencer Mine Coal Company, expects to have coal in the Eugene market this fall. The roads to the mines, which are about ten miles southwest of Eugene, are very good for hauling while dry, but in winter are impassable for heavy loads.

Mr. Zimmerman says he has the promise of Mr. Carver to run the Sitka railroad by his mine. In case this road should not be built the company expects to build one to the mines themselves.

Sloat & Ellico, who have the contract for sinking the main shaft, have the jacket and all other paraphernalia up, and are waiting upon some buckets to lift the dirt with. They are expected at any time.

Yesterday Mr. Zimmerman received an order for \$1000 worth of stock by mail in one lot. Other smaller bunches were also sold.

PAVING COMPANY HAS NOT ENOUGH MEN AS YET

The street railway company has enough men now, all that were needed being hired yesterday. The paving company, despite the fact that a number also joined them yesterday, are still in need of more men. The work to some extent will be held back if more men cannot be secured, for when the rock crusher is started again there will be a dearth of laborers to push the paving operations.

Laborers are very scarce all over the West, and in summer, when harvest demands a great many of them, only high wages attract any great number.

Among the best laboring men in the country are the Scandinavians, but they are hard to get. In common with most people of Northern Europe they look to the future, and prefer to go to the farms and woods, where they may make homes for themselves and become independent.

According to Superintendent Chipman the Italian laborers are the best for big jobs in the United States. These men seem to like to work in large numbers, and are the most available in the labor market today.

ONLY MOTHER MOURNED DAUGHTER

Portland, Or., Aug. 5.—Rachel Hathaway, the 19-year-old girl who committed suicide Friday because Edward Small was going to leave her, was buried today at 10 o'clock in Lone Fir cemetery. Only her mother, who came from Eugene, and officials of the coroner's office were present. The girl was laid to rest after a prayer by Deputy Coroner Skewes.

STEAM ROLLER MAY HAVE CAUSED FIRE

A new theory for the starting of the fire yesterday is advanced and given backing by the fact that the steam roller set afire this morning two more awnings, that of McCormick's cigar store and the Register office, and burned holes in them. It was suggested yesterday that the engine might have been the cause of the fire, but the suggestion was given little credence. Now, however, it seems that there may be some likelihood of it being the cause.

The engine several days ago set fire to the awning of Burden & Graham's shoe store, and a man on the street, who was sitting some distance from the engine, had his shirt burned a little by a spark.

Thus it would be possible for the fire to have originated in that way, even though the steam roller was half a block away from the place of its origin.

Today, however, a sparkler will be put on, and no more danger will be run.

SUICIDES BECAUSE HIS FARM IS GONE

Salem, Or., Aug. 5.—James Conklin, an old man in the Sunnyside district, a few miles from Salem, committed suicide by taking carbolic acid yesterday shortly before noon. He lived alone in a cabin on his farm. He had been despondent for several weeks and frequently hinted at suicide. He was seen in Salem Saturday intoxicated.

He recently sold his farm and the cabin in which he lived, and it is known he regretted this action and became deeply dejected, brooding over it.

He had previously made at least one attempt to take his life.
