SPECIAL RATE TO EUGENE FROM ROSEBURG

The Southern Pacific has granted a temporary freight rate of 15 cents per 100 pounds on green fruit in carload lots and 20 cents for less than carload lots from Roseburg to Eugene. This rate will be effective from August 1 to October 15, when it will expire. The reduction is made for the benefit of those shipping green fruit to the Eugene canneries.

TOOLE GIRL IN TROUBLE ONCE MORE

J. D. Sadler, a conductor on the Upper Albion carline, was arrested yesterday afternoon by Probation officer White, of the juvenile court, on a charge of lewd cohabitation. The warrant was sworn out by Charles Toole, brother of 17-year-old Emma Toole, the girl in the case. As the girl is under age she will be brought before the juvenile court. Another warrant was issued on a similar charge for Roy Morrison, but so far the police have not been able to arrest him. Unable to raise the \$1000 bail, Sadler was locked up in the city jail.—Oregonian.

LOGGING CAMPS READY TO RESUME

Loggers owning camps on the Columbia river and its tributaries will hold another meeting at the Chamber of Commerce rooms Saturday afternoon, when it is probable logging operations will be ordered resumed August 15. For the past six weeks these camps have remained closed, in order that the surplus of logs existing July 1 might be reduced. Practically all of these logs have been sold, and if the lumber mills are to be supplied it will be necessary for the camps to start up again.—Oregonian.

GRANGE STANDS BY JUDGE GALLOWAY

McMinnville, Or., Aug. 7.—The members of McMinnville Grange, Patrons of Husbandry, have endorsed the action of Circuit Judge Galloway in throwing out the referendum petition on the compulsory pass law, the appropriation of \$100,000 for state armories and the state university appropriation because the text of the petitions did not include the warning clause. This action of the McMinnville Grangers is significant, since many of the other granges throughout the state have adopted resolutions censuring Judge Galloway.

The Grange adopted resolutions embodying the findings of the committee, which consisted of Mr. Richardson, master; B. S. Clark and Geo. Thompson.

The latest report from the headquarters of the Western Federation of Miners at Denver is to the effect that Clarence Morrow, of Chicago, well known as a socialist, has been dismissed as attorney. E. F. Richardson will be in charge of the defense of Meyer and Pettibone, when their trials come up at Boise in October.
