RAILWAY TRACK ALL LAID ON WILLAMETTE

There are seven blocks of street railway laid in Eugene, and the work this afternoon began on Eleventh street, and practically all of Willamette street is finished. The block between Tenth and Eleventh was several inches off grade and six extra inches of hard gravel had to be dug through. As the weather was

cool, however, the men worked with far more energy than on hot days, and very little delay was caused. Considering the quality of the ground, the tracklaying should be completed as far as Alder street in the same time that the track up Willamette has been put down.

SPRINGFIELD'S SEWER SYSTEM NEARLY FINISHED

In about two weeks the sewer system of Springfield will be completed, and the sewage of the sawmill city—that of a thousand people—will be turned into the Willamette river, so that Eugene will get the full effect of the filth that is drained off. While the river is perfectly able to carry off the burden, it will contaminate it forever more as a source for drinking water, at least whenever public health is concerned.

McClain & McArthur, the contractors, who have been putting in the system, have had extraordinary luck, and will get through two weeks before they expected. They began work the latter part of June, thus doing the work in seven weeks.

Nevertheless they have had their troubles, and their labor supply has been especially perplexing. Of all the men that began the first of the month, only one has stayed until the present time, and that one is a tramp they picked up.

They have employed at times as high as twenty men, but frequently they have had only ten. They hardly know how many they will have each morning. The wages paid are \$2.25 for common labor, while pipe layers and the more particular positions received more.

McClain and McArthur are both university men, graduates of the university engineering department. McClain was formerly the Y. M. C. A. secretary, and a football player, and McArthur a debater and leader in college politics and student enterprises.

EUGENE'S FIRE HORSES ARE VERY INTELLIGENT

Fire horses are the noblest of all their kind, and Eugene's fine black pair rank with any, for offers have been made for them of at least \$1,000. While the life they lead is not that of a plow horse, when exertion is required it is of the greatest and most severe, for it does not take a run of so very many blocks to exhaust any team of horses with an engine that weighs tons.

The names of Eugene's team are Ned and Flora. Ned is the big black boy that has the whitest spot in his forehead, while the most distinct marks of Flora, who is no baby herself, is the white just above the hoofs of her hind legs.

Both are very gentle, but Ned sometimes is cross and uses his teeth. Flora is more ladylike and polite. You can pet either one you please, and the other will not grow jealous which tends to show that the horses are more noble than men—at least Eugene's fire horses.

They are like children in many ways, too, for when they smell candy they renege for just a bite, the same as any youngster you happen to know.

But they, too, know what serious business means, and you cannot fool them when there is a fire. For instance, when exercising on the street if a telephone rings especially plain they jump, thinking for a second that it is an alarm. The way they tell, when it really means business, is by the actions of Charles Croner, their driver, and he says he cannot fool them.

To ordinary admirers they pay but little attention, and to their best friends are rather dignified and unless they want something especially are a little distant.
