FIRST RINGLING
CAR HAS LEFT
ITS TRAIL

SHOW BILLS TELL OF MANY

EUGENE EATS
MANY BUNCHES
OF BANANAS

Bananas have a fine sale here, according to G. W. Dixon, the proprietor of the Seattle Produce Company. Moreover, the sale of the fruit is not pushed by the dealers, either, for they claim that they do not make anything off of their banana sales, but only keep them for the accommodation of their customers. Therefore, if you want to eat something on which little money is made, just purchase bananas.

The dealers say that they make a little on some bunches, but that on others they lose just about as much. The reason lies in the fact that bananas are bought by the pound and sold by the dozen. Thus when a dealer asks three for a dime, you may know you are getting big bananas, which usually give you more weight than the two for a nickel kind.

The retailer also pays for the stem while he can only sell the fruit itself. Eugene consumes a great many bananas, more than most towns of its size. Probably as a conservative estimate the town will eat thirty bunches a week.

Oranges are much more popular than bananas, for in the season some days as high as fifty boxes will be sold. Another curious thing about bananas is that they do not grow as they hang in your groceryman's store, but inversely, that is, the fruit sticks into the air and does not hang downward.

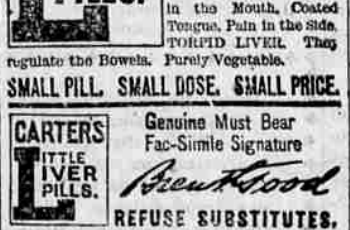
