## MARKSMEN OF O. N. G. COMPANIES AT PRACTICE

Considerable interest is being taken in the shooting records of the individuals in the two O. N. G. companies in Eugene, for the records which give the various individuals their rank as sharpshooters are now being shot off on the ranges south of Eugene. This fall more men will participate in the contests, for with cooler weather practicing will be more comfortable. Each man has so much ammunition with which to practice to shoot for his scores. In the ranking of the guardsmen there are four grades, the plain private who has made no scores entitling him to special recognition, the marksman, the sharpshooter and the expert rifleman. The qualifications for marksmen are that the candidate must make 98 points out of a possible 150 on es and runs from the 600-yard range. He has ten shots at each range. In order to be allowed to try for the rank of sharpshooter he must make a total of 120 out of 150. To attain the rank of a sharpshooter he must make 40 points at the 600-yard range, at time five 25 points out of a possible 50, two strings of five shots being fired in 20 seconds each. In the skirmish run, in which he fires twenty shots at different ranges and runs from the 600-yard range to the 200-yard range in a given time, he must make enough to make his total 235 out of a sharpshooter, in order to qualify as a sharpshooter. In the expert rifleman grade he must make 40 points out of 50 at the 300-yard range, and 35 out of 50 at the 1000-yard range in addition to having qualified at the other ranges. Company A has had the best record so far, but this year Company C will endeavor to catch up with them in records. Captain Williams, of Company C, is in Eugene.

## EUGENE WILL

### HAVE NEW BANK OCTOBER 1

PROMINENT BUSINESSMEN FORM \$800,000 CORPORATION TO DO GENERAL BANKING BUSINESS. RUMORED THAT THEY WERE COMPELLED TO THE MOVE BY OTHER PARTIES

A new bank will be established in Eugene October 1, and will be incorporated under the name of the Merchants' Bank, with a capitalization of \$800,000. It will be located in the Hampton building, which Hall & Shumway have just vacated, and will be furnished with a modern vault and up-to-date furnishings.

The men behind the bank are well-known business men, who thoroughly understand the business, and will undoubtedly make a success of their venture. The very fact that these men, who do not care to have their names published at present, are behind the corporation is assurance that there will be sufficient backing to insure its success.

While Eugene has three banks already, when it is considered what the future promises for the city, it may be seen that there is room for a fourth bank. It is rumored that the present bank was started in a hurry in order not to be crowded out by other parties who were considering entering the field.

Bank at Florence. The papers for the bank at Florence, known as the Florence State Bank, have been filed with the county clerk. The incorporators of the bank are Alfred P. Goss, Dennis M. Kemp and W. H. Weatherston. The bank capitalization is \$10,000.

### IDAHO LUMBERMEN WANT DIFFERENTIAL

Seattle, Wash., Aug. 16.—Idaho lumber manufacturers will make an independent fight for a reduction in the railroad rates that the transcontinental lines will put into effect October 1. They are to insist on a 10-cent differential in favor of Idaho lumber interests, something that coast manufacturers cannot accept, and that this prevents an alliance between the coast and the interior on the general proposition of opposing the advance in lumber and shingle rates, on which the two associations of timber-working associations are agreed.

They will fight any rate increase together, but as a side issue the Idaho manufacturers, the Eastern Oregon and Eastern Washington wood-working manufacturers will request a differential of 10 cents per hundred pounds in their behalf.
