SCHOOL AND CHURCH FURNISHING ESTABLISHMENT

BUSHNELL, CRANE & CO., REAL ESTATE BROKERS, WILL ESTABLISH SUPPLY HOUSE IN EUGENE--WILL MOVE INTO FINE OFFICE ROOMS IN BROTHERS BLOCK.

Bushnell, Crane & Co., the real estate dealers, whose office is in the Matlock building on West Eighth street, have engaged the three front office rooms on the second floor of the new Brothers block and will open therein on the first of September a supply house for opera house, school, bank and church furnishings. This is something new in Eugene and will be the only house of its kind between Portland and San Francisco.

The office rooms of the firm in the new location will be the finest in the city. The furniture, which has already been ordered, will be finished in leather and the finest of carpets will be placed on the floors. The firm will represent the Peabody School Furnishing Company, of Indiana, and the Cincinnati Seating Company. They will carry a full line of samples from these houses, besides maintaining a warehouse in a different part of the city in which will be kept a stock of goods. All kinds of church and school furnishings will be carried, including maps, globes, charts, blackboards, and in fact everything that is needed in the school room and the church, as well as bank and theatre furniture.

A carload of goods for the firm was shipped from Chicago on the 20th, and is due to arrive here within a few days. A draft for the shipment was forwarded this morning.

The firm will continue its real estate business as before. Wm. Crane, however, devoting a great deal of his attention to the furnishing business. He was formerly employed as a traveling salesman for these two Eastern firms and knows the business thoroughly.

Already two or three large orders for church and school furniture have been received by the firm, and several more are in sight. The new departure promises to be a success as there is a good field here for that line of business.

RUMORED MURDER OF MOORISH SULTAN

London, Aug. 28.—The Tangier correspondent of the Tribune telegraphs under reserve a rumor that the sultan, Abdul Aziz, has been assassinated in his palace at Fez.

WILL ATTEMPT TO TRAP HOSTILE MOORS

Casa Blanca, Aug. 28.—General Druide has decided to dispatch a portion of the French force five miles south in an endeavor to trap the Moors.

The preliminary trials of fifty prisoners, charged with assassination and pillage and countenance with the hostile Moors, has been commenced.

Will Furnish Troops

Paris, Aug. 28.—Premier Clemenceau declared today that the French commander at Morocco would be given all the troops necessary to carry out the mission to which he has been delegated.

The government has no confirmation of the rumor that the sultan of Morocco has been assassinated, and also continues ignorant of the real purposes of the sultan's brother, who was recently proclaimed sultan.
