SAWMILLS WILL CLOSE DOWN ONCE MORE

CAR SHORTAGE STILL CONTINUES--WENDLING MILL CLOSED DOWN SATURDAY AND SAGINAW MILL WILL QUIT WORK ON OCTOBER 1--BOOTH-KELLY CO. HAD NO FIRES THIS SUMMER.

The scarcity of cars on the Southern Pacific Company's lines for lumber shipments still continues, and as a consequence some of the mills of Lane county are closing down for an indefinite period. Geo. H. Kelly, general manager of the Booth-Kelly Lumber Company, today informed a reporter that the company's big mill at Wendling was closed down Saturday of last week and the mill at Saginaw will be closed on the first of October, or just as soon as some large Eastern orders now on hand are cleaned up. The mills at Springfield and Coburg are only running single shifts, but they will probably continue in operation despite the car situation.

Mr. Kelly stated that the new freight rate on lumber which goes into effect the first of October is also going to have a great deal of effect upon the industry in this state. He says there is a great advance in all territory between Ogden and Chicago, and the new rate to Chicago under the new schedule will be something like \$3 a thousand feet higher than at present. This will be prohibitive and will shut out the coast mills from that market entirely. Mr. Kelly says, as they cannot ship their lumber under that rate and make a profit, in fact, they would lose money on the shipments.

No Fires This Year.
Mr. Kelly stated that his company has been very fortunate this summer in regard to forest fires. There has not been a single fire in the green timber covered by the company's forest patrol and if there is none within the next fifteen days all danger for this year will be over. There have been a few small blazes in different parts of the mountains close to the company's timber, but the system of patrols maintained by the company is so perfect that in each instance they have been prevented from spreading. So far this is the best year in the history of the company's operations in Lane county in regard to fires.

PIPE LINE WILL CROSS RIVER ON TRESTLE WORK

The Willamette Valley Company received a pile driver a couple of days ago for the purpose of driving piles in the river opposite the pumping station for a trestle on which the pipe line from the well across the river to the station will be laid. It will be remembered that during the high water last winter at several times the company had a great deal of trouble with the pipe line and it is intended to obviate this by keeping the pipe above the highest water mark. The work has already begun, and the trestle will be finished before the first freshet arrives.

MAYOR TEARS DOWN TELEPHONE WIRES

Exasperated by what he regards as the dilatory tactics of the Northwestern Long Distance Telephone Company, in failing to heed his warning to ask the Salem city council for an ordinance permitting it to engage in the long distance telephone business in this city, Mayor Rodgers last evening elected to take matters in his own hands, and, assisted by City Marshal Gibson and a lineman of the Portland General Electric Company, he cut and disconnected the Northwestern Company's wires and put the company out of business at least temporarily, or until the company complies with the provisions of the city ordinance and charter.
