**DEMANDS OF BUSINESS WILL CAUSE NO PANIC**  
 A critical review of the financial situation in England sets forth that there is in such great demand for ordinary purposes that there is no reason to expect a panic. The only thing that could seriously damage the business would be the precipitating of a financial convulsion through the demands of speculation. In that event, the banks would be obliged to go to the support of the houses affected by speculative operations, and general business would be cramped to such an extent that failures might ensue. But there is nothing to indicate that any such danger exists. The situation is therefore encouraging.  
 The demands of business are never going to cause a panic. There may be a fall in the price of certain kinds of securities, but the market is so strong that it will absorb them without there being any chance for returns to come in from them; but legitimate business is automatically regulated by the law of supply and demand, and even though it needs vast sums for its operations, this demand will not cause distress unless a period of reaction is indicated in connection with it, tying up capital and weakening credit.  
 The situation in England is therefore encouraging to the highest degree. This is made more pronounced by reason of the fact that for some time there has been a competition that business of all kinds was of a depressing character. It has got over that condition and is free to operate without embarrassing financial conditions brought about by speculation, and we may look for it to pull out strong.  
 Very much the same conditions prevail in this country. Speculation has been adding against business for money and this has caused some disturbance, but this is passing away without any serious harm having been experienced, and we may look for trade and industries to continue prosperous in the highest degree.  
 A young man with practical knowledge in his head, skill in his hands and health in his body is his own letter of reference. Mix him up with fifty millions of others and you will find him as good as dead. Throw him naked into a desert island and he will be at the head of the class. He does not go whining over the land, blaming for it and saying he has no chance, but goes out and does something, and gets out and does it again and better. Men that can do things either with head or hands are the men that are wanted, and the demand is as great here and now as it has been at any time since the beginning.
