WILL TEACH WITHOUT PAY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON BOARD OF REGENTS DECIDES TO SUSPEND SALARIES TILL MONEY IS AVAILABLE FROM \$125,000 APPROPRIATION

The board of regents of the University of Oregon met yesterday in Portland to provide for meeting the expenses of the coming school year. C. A. Dolph, Judge R. S. Bean, of Salem, M. A. Miller, of Lebanon, S. H. Friendly, of Eugene, F. V. Holman and J. C. Ainsworth, of Portland, were present. Regent Smith of Baker City, Butler, of Dallas, and Hamilton, of Roseburg, were absent. The university will be greatly in need of funds to meet the current expenses during the coming year, on account of the referendum on the last appropriation of \$125,000, which makes this sum unavailable. About \$75,000 is required each year to meet the current expenses, and only the continuing appropriation of \$47,000, with about \$10,000 from other sources, is available until next year. By the end of the third quarter, October 1, practically all the salary money will be exhausted. As the board of regents is forbidden to incur indebtedness, the only plan to be adopted is to suspend salaries for the coming year. The board is understanding that the salaries will be paid in cash the year on the university appropriation is favorable. This proposition will be made to the faculty of the state university, and it is believed the teachers will accept this plan. Resolution adopted by the regents provides to pay the teachers next year.

The condition to be met is practically the same as that of two years ago, when on account of lack of funds salaries were reduced. By January it is expected that money will be forthcoming to meet all expenses. At the meeting confidence was expressed in the ability to pay salaries ultimately, and all of the teachers will probably stay, despite the fact that some have had offers of better salaries during the year from other institutions. The enrollment during the coming year is expected to be from 15 to 20 per cent ahead of that of last year. Provision has been made to maintain the standard of efficiency of the institution, and a number of new teachers have been secured.
