MRS. CRUZAN FINED \$250 FOR SELLING LIQUOR

JURY RETURNS VERDICT OF GUILTY WITHOUT LEAVING JURY BOX—DEFENSE OFFERED NO TESTIMONY—CASE WILL BE APPEALED TO CIRCUIT COURT—GEO. LILL FINED

Mrs. Alice Cruzan, keeper of a questionable resort at Marcola, was fined \$250 and costs in the Eugene justice court today for selling liquor in violation of the local option law.

Her trial came up at 9 o'clock in the forenoon and the courtroom was filled with witnesses and idle spectators. The jury that had been chosen the evening before consisted of the following: P. D. Newell, G. E. Kress, W. W. Haines, A. C. Jennings, D. L. Cartmell and Samuel Taylor.

The state examined a number of witnesses, including the two detectives who have been testifying in other cases during the week, and several citizens of Marcola. The defense offered no testimony at all. The jury returned a verdict of guilty without leaving the jury box. The defense waived the time for sentence and Judge Bryan imposed a fine of \$250. Mrs. Cruzan's attorney, J. M. Pipes, immediately filed a notice of appeal to the circuit court, and the woman's bond was fixed at \$400. Mrs. Pinchott, who was arrested at the same time and on the same charge, is not in the city and cannot be found.

Lill Fined \$200.

George Lill, who was previously found guilty of selling liquor at his cigar store in Eugene, was fined \$200 by the justice of the peace today. He also served notice of appeal to the circuit court.

Of the six persons arrested last week for the alleged violation of the local option law two have been convicted, one acquitted, the jury in two cases have disagreed, and one of the parties under arrest has disappeared.

NEW TEACHER FOR SCHOOL OF MUSIC

MRS. STEPHANIE SCHNECKER, OF BOSTON, CHOSEN TO FILL PLACE MADE VACANT BY MISS WHITESIDE'S RESIGNATION.

The vacancy in the piano department of the University of Oregon School of Music, caused by the resignation of Miss Whiteside, has been filled by the election of Mrs. Stephanie Schaecker, of Boston. Miss Schaecker is known as a musician over the entire country. She pursued her studies in musical theory and harmony under George Chadwick, the famous composer of Boston, and Gustave Strube of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. Her piano study has been under the guidance of the best known teachers in the west and in Boston, in addition to special work taken in Vienna with pupils of the great Lischitzky. Mrs. Schaecker's abilities as a concert performer are not confined to the piano, however. She has even more than a national reputation as a harpist, having appeared in concert not only with the prominent orchestras and conductors in this country, but in London, Paris and Vienna.

It was altogether a fortunate accident that enabled the music school to secure Mrs. Schaecker's services for this year, and in securing her, the music school is in a position to offer a rare and unusual opportunity to its old students and prospective ones in piano and theory study.

Mrs. Pope, the vocal teacher, and Mrs. Schaecker will both be in Eugene next week and will receive pupils at the University studios.

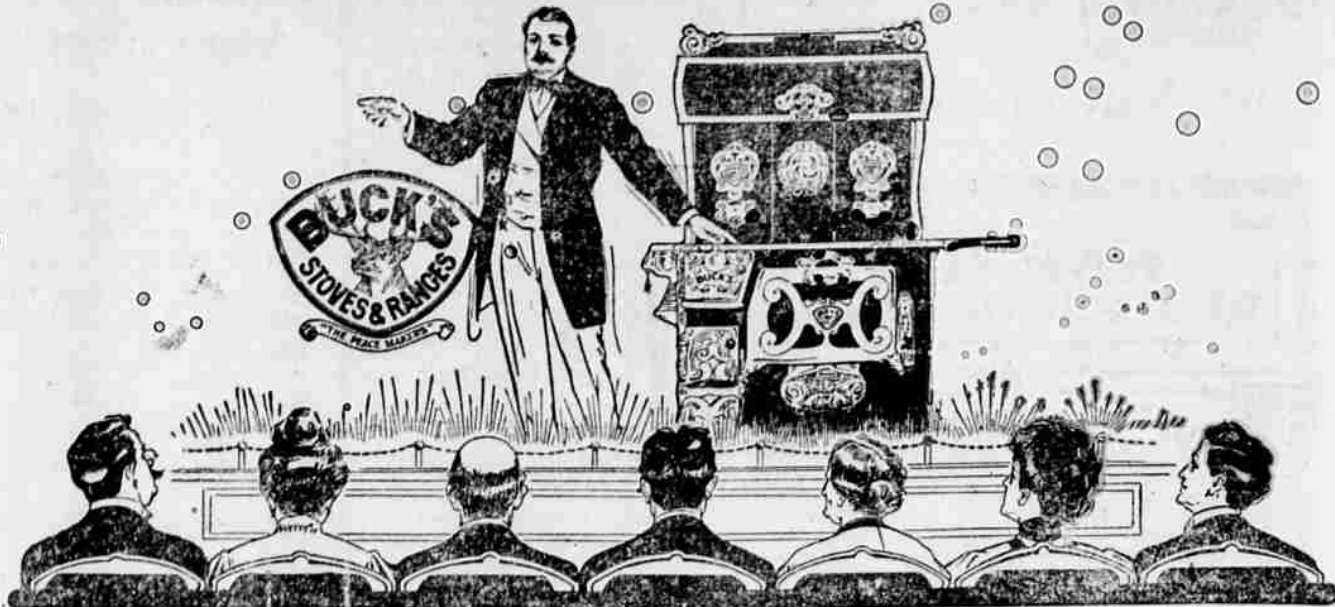

ANNOUNCEMENT OF PAROCHIAL SCHOOL OPENING

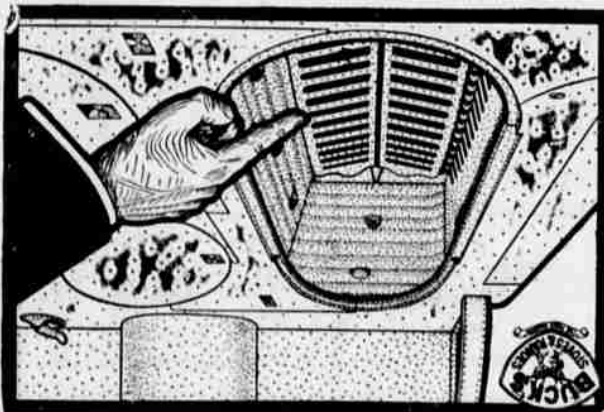
The Sisters of Mercy parochial school will re-open Wednesday, September 25th. All the pupils are requested to be prompt in starting school on the first day.

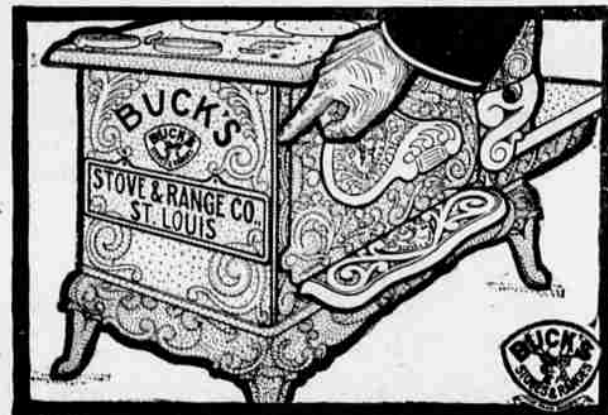
