For fancy Spitzenberg apples \$3.25 a box and for Newtown Yellow Pippins \$2.75 a box are the prices received by the Hood River Applegrowers' Union, under its contract for the sale of this year's crop of those varieties to the Davidson Fruit company of Hood river. The prices for this season's crop had not heretofore been made public. They are the highest ever realized by the Hood river union. It is estimated that the output of Spitzenbergs will amount to about 12,000 boxes, and of Pippins about 13,000 boxes. Oscar Vanderbilt, vice-president of the union, and the largest apple grower in the Hood river valley, who is now at the Portland hotel, is the authority for this statement.—Oregonian.

He believes that when the bulletin is finished and distributed that the Oregon lumbermen will realize the importance of the station more than at any previous time.
