"BIGGEST MAN" LITTLEST WOMAN BEFORE CAMERA

AS THEY STOOD TALKING TOGETHER ON THE RECENT VISIT OF SECRETARY TAFT TO MINNEAPOLIS.

The recent visit to the northwest of Secretary of War William H. Taft, resulted in the meeting of what many regard as the "biggest" man in American politics and the greatest little woman in the world—Mrs. Gen. Tom Thumb. The widow of the historical Tom Thumb is now the stellar feature with the Gentry Brothers' famous shows which are to exhibit in Eugene Tuesday, Oct. 15 and while the shows were in Minneapolis Secretary Taft was announced for a speech in the state university there.

Mrs. Gen. Tom Thumb, who is now the Countess Maeri, through her marriage to Count Primo Maeri several years ago, has met many notables during her long career but had never either seen or heard the big Secretary of War, so when she found she was one of many hundreds who were unable to gain admission to the university armory she accepted the opportunity to hold an infor-

mal reception until such time as the possible candidate for president of the United States should have finished—for she is a determined little lady and memorably carries out any plan formulated.

It was Mrs. Gen. Tom Thumb, therefore, to whom Secretary Taft was first presented as he left the armory and the "official" photographer was on hand to note the fact that the secretary was hugely pleased and the little lady diminutively "delighted."

"I've met many big men in my time," said the countess.

"And I try not to overlook the smallest detail," said the man of war and politics, and after these had been further exchange of pleasant-ness and the distinguished diplomat and the famous midget had been duly "posed," the secretary proceeded on his eastern way and the countess on her western tour.

During the forty-eight years Mrs. Tom Thumb has been before the public she has toured practically every country on the globe, and has shaken hands with more people than any other person in the world. This is her own declaration and no one can look her in the eye and dispute it.

"It makes me smile when I read about this political candidate or that suffering from a lame arm from too much hand shaking," she says. "I've traveled 500,000 miles in my time and I've been shaking hands with people every since I can remember. Once at St. Johns, Canada, I shook hands with 1,000 people in succession, and I never thought of getting a lame arm."

Among the world famous personages with whom the countess has shaken hands have been General Grant, General Robert E. Lee, President Lincoln, Queen Victoria, Napoleon, II, Empress Eugenie, Emperor Francis Joseph, the King of Benares and hosts of far eastern men of note. So meeting Secretary Taft was only an incident. "He's without doubt the biggest man I know," she says.
