TRACK TO CAR

BARN COMPLETED

LINE OUT UNIVERSITY AVENUE
EAST L. O. O. F. CEMETERY AND
TO MASONIC CEMETERY BEING
BUILT

The street car line was completed to the car barn in the University addition today and the cars were run on this afternoon. While the one car is in operation the other two will be protected from the weather. The barn will hold six cars, the number to be used when the line to Springfield is completed. The other three have been ordered and will arrive within the course of several months. They will be here by the time the line is completed. Work on the line out University avenue, to extend as far south as the Masonic cemetery and past the L. O. O. F. cemetery, was begun this morning. There are 30 or 35 men and a number of teams at work and construction will be rushed. The ties and rails have been distributed along the entire route. This line will pass through the Gross addition, which is about to be placed on the market.
